A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Friends,

Advent allows us to start fresh to draw near to God, "...while God wills to be found." Deep joy is the result of a faithful Advent. Practicing a waiting Spirit, while God makes the incremental changes every day. We can rule the chaos that seems to overtake life. We find the path that God clears before us. Waiting and watching, "reading the signs of the fig tree," we discover our prayers have made us vulnerable to God, and we are glad. Find new ways to pray, with the words that spring out in natural thanksgiving, or practice sitting in quiet "wordless" prayer all the while knowing God to be present in the silence. Advent starts a wilderness desert, with a lone voice calling to God. We are that voice, waiting while God makes green our path.

So we offer our Advent Wreath making on December 2 after church (and again on Monday at 5:30 PM – bring snacks and "greens" to share). The wreath can help us refocus our daily prayer in the home, as God re-orients our space as God's space. Scriptures and prayer are the ancient path to God's presence. Come along, and experiment how to share the Love of the Holy One beyond our normal circles.

The liturgy on Sunday will open with quiet symbols of light and prayer, and hone the themes of God sharing life itself with us. O come, O come let us adore the ONE long expected, the Redeemer of Israel!! The Prince of Peace!!!

Winter coats for men, women, youth and children will be available on Saturday mornings from 9-11am, through December 15. Clean, gently used coats are always in need!




