Dear Friends,
Our Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, was present to lead a revival in Western MA and the echoes are still reverberating. He asked us to grow by walking in “the way of Love.” Jesus’ own way. Part of a new curriculum developed from this revival has a lesson called “Turn.” As in, ‘turn from your old ways’ and walk the way of Love. It is a needed reminder to which we can resort at any time and with good benefit. So, try this exercise: Sit in a quiet place. Try to remember a time when you were physically lost. Perhaps you were driving, or went to jog in a new unfamiliar area of town and suddenly –

fear and panic set in! How did you find your way back? Back ‘to yourself?’ Now ask yourself, “Did you ever change your mind? What did it take to change your mind? Were there lasting results?” Now try to remember a Lenten practice that has changed you. When have you been spiritually lost and yet God made a path to you? Or you to God? Try meditating about these ideas periodically through the season to see if you realize new hope for the Easter victory we await.

Lent is also the opportunity to draw close to God in prayer and silence; meditation on the words of Scripture -and - the Christ of God, the Living WORD contained therein; in the right use

of the sacraments and the growth of love of all people, which issues in the corporal acts of mercy and the desire for racial reconciliation. Lent was time when Jesus Christ journeyed toward His death in order to be faithful to the mission of God (reconciliation of all people to their God and to each other), learning to resist what drew Him away from His core task.

Lent remains as a season of preparation for us, also moving toward the joy of Easter victory! Learning more about the hope that is in us, through the work Jesus has done!

Simple Soup Supper During Lent

Are you a flawed and faithful Disciple too?

The New Hope United Church of Christ has invited us to join in a wonderful Lenten Study based on the book *Simon Peter: a Flawed and Faithful Disciple* by Adam Hamilton.

The New Hope United Church of Christ (housed at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church) will host a Community Simple Soup Supper

each **THURSDAY** night, March 14 through April 11. Together we'll have fun spreading the good news that we are really all like Peter. **Fr. Richard will be leading the study on March 28 and HTC is responsible for the meal that evening.** A sign up sheet will be located on the back table of the church. We will need volunteers to bring soup, bread, and dessert. Additionally this year, there will be a service of prayer and song

(similar to Taize) at 6 pm! We'll sing simple chant-like songs while we pray. The same songs will be sung each week. It is a beautiful way to "get in the mood" as you leave your cares safely in God's hands. Please mark your calendar to join us for **SONG, SOUP, & STUDY each Thursday evening in Lent.**

Vigil Candle: The Light of the Presence!

The use of a Vigil Candle is an ancient practice that comes down to us from the Synagogue. The obvious function was to light the space in the Temple, but it also signifies the holiness of the Torah scrolls kept for the reading of the Law. In this regard one can easily see it also meant the light of truth, and the presence of the Living God who inhabits the Holy of Holies. In Christian tradition, the Vigil Candle burns to symbolize

the presence of Jesus in the Holy sanctuary, and it remains lit anytime the sacrament of the Body and the Blood are being held in reserve for the use of the sick, or others who may desire to receive communion in special circumstances.

A Vigil Candle dedication may be given as a memorial for the deceased or to burn as a special intention or prayer request. To

give a Vigil Candle dedication, one may sign the sheet provided in the back of the church or include the information on a slip of paper with your check and place it in the offering basket. There is no set donation amount—please donate an amount you are comfortable with.
