

A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

This month we will share a message from the House of Bishops of the Episcopal Church. I ask you to consider their concerns and their words of Godly admonition.

"We reject the idolatrous notion that we can ensure the safety of some by sacrificing the hopes of others." March 15, 2016

The House of Bishops of The Episcopal Church, meeting in retreat, unanimously approved the following Word To The Church.

A Word to the Church Holy Week 2016

"We reject the idolatrous notion that we can ensure the safety of some by sacrificing the hopes of others."

On Good Friday the ruling political forces of the day tortured and executed an innocent man. They sacrificed the weak and the blameless to protect their own status and power. On the third day Jesus was raised from the dead, revealing not only their injustice but also unmasking the lie that might makes right.

In a country still living under the shadow of the lynching tree, we are troubled by the violent forces being released by this season's political rhetoric. Americans are turning against their neighbors, particularly those on the margins of society. They seek to secure their own safety and security at the expense of others. There is legitimate reason to fear where this rhetoric and the actions arising from it might take us.

In this moment, we resemble God's children wandering in the wilderness. We, like they, are struggling to find our way. They turned from following God and worshiped a golden calf constructed from their own wealth. The current rhetoric is leading us to construct a modern false idol out of power and privilege. We reject the idolatrous notion that we can ensure the safety of some by sacrificing the hopes of others. No matter where we fall on the political spectrum, we must respect the dignity of every human being and we must seek the common good above all else.

We call for prayer for our country that a spirit of reconciliation will prevail and we will not betray our true selves.

The Episcopal Church House of Bishops met in retreat March 11 – 15 at Camp Allen Conference Center in Navasota, TX.

February 2016 Financial Report

We are two months into 2016 and the budget looks reasonable.

On the income side

- Adjusting for prepaid pledges the pledges are behind budget by \$2,680.
- The plate "offering: other" is over budget.
- Last year's pledge was \$1,200, which is not budgeted.

On the expense side

- The over budget lines are:
 - building repair and maintenance and capital expense.
 - The electric bill is over budget by 65%; this is due to the YMCA rental. This was taken into consideration in the rent.
 - Both Christian Formation lines are slightly over budget.
- Oil and Insurance are paid once or twice a year; 1/12 of the budgeted amount is moved into a reserve fund monthly. (See statement of financial position)
- We will have the sewer bill to pay in March, \$1,200 plus \$225 for the emergency diagnostic call.

Oil report

We started the 2015-2016 Season with 6,928 gallons. As of 2.1.16 we used 2,878 gallons and we have 4,050 left. It has been a fairly warm winter, but on average we have used 16 gallons a day with the YMCA in the building 5 days a week since December 1. Last year at this time the oil usage was 18.4 gallons a day on average. We got a price of \$1.45/gallon for 3,000 gallons, which will refill the oil tank; there is more than enough money in the Fuel Fund to pay this bill.

NEW HTEC LOGO

Hoty Trinity Episcopal Church I was honored when I was asked to design a new logo for Holy Trinity. Tamsin explained that the vestry was looking for a logo that could be used for marketing and branding and also used on new letterhead. A logo that would be recognized by the community, the churched and the un-churched.

My first thought in the process was that the cross is recognized by the churched and un-churched as being the symbol of Christianity. When I started designing I stopped when the vertical lines of the cross looked like a staff. The staff is used in the bible as a symbol of shepherding the flock and would represent the Holy Trinity Community. Then I added the three diamonds for the Trinity. I give credit to Tamsin for pointing out the diamonds are pointing out to the outside community.





My God moment came when my mother texted me a picture of the stain glass window in the church doors. I could not believe how similar the logo was. The stain glass windows on the sides of the church have a similar cross inside a diamond. I like to think I had help designing this new logo.
