## A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD SIGNORE

Dear friends,

The season is turning from festival and harvest, to something much colder and darker. The Church colors take on a somber purple for Advent, and we are in a suspended animation - waiting to see God act in our midst to establish the reign of Peace. It is a season for children; it is a season for soldiers, it is a season for those struggling with illness, it is a season for those juggling their bills: all hoping to see God act, waiting.... Waiting.....

Learning to wait well is key! Advent is traditionally a time to renew the old disciplines of prayer, quiet time apart with God, reading scripture, and giving for the hungry, naked, the destitute. When we act on the promise of God's reign, we also see it take shape in our lives.

To start, I suggest using the Advent materials for use in the home, which, we will have available at the parish. There are ways to involve the family; for example you can read the prayer for Sunday and one of the scripture readings from the bulletin while lighting an Advent wreath candle. Perhaps before children go to bed, or at grace for supper. The manger can be set up on December 1<sup>st</sup> (no Jesus yet!) and the animal figure, or the three Kings placed several rooms away (they arrive January 6<sup>th</sup>). Each day have the children move them a little closer, and playfully enter into the sense of anticipation, that the caring of God comes to rest on us.

And be renewed in your love of that Kingdom ushered in by the helpless infant child!! May God bless your Advent journey!

## October Financial Report

On the income side, fundraising and plate offerings are over budget; rental income and pledge income are under budget.

On the expense side oil is over budget, but ½ of the 2014 heating season is paid in advance. A few lines are under budget.

Total income for the operating budget is \$105,777 through 10/31/13.

Total expense from the operating budget is \$84,039 through 10/31/13.

With a healthy designated bank balance, money was reserved in various funds (See statement of financial position.)

The Portico and Column bill will come due soon and funds are reserved to pay that bill.

### Portico and column restoration update

We are most happy to report that the portico and column restoration project is finished just in time for Thanksgiving and Advent...Thanks Be to God! Through the generosity and love of our parish members, \$11,245 was pledged for this restoration and original architectural elements of our building have been reconstructed and preserved. ## **STEWARDSHIP NEWS**

The year is almost over and we look forward to 2014. We have much to be thankful for this year as a parish. God's abundant blessings were shared at the Commitment Sunday brunch on Sunday November 3, 2013.

Parishioners were asked to share with another person how their faith had flourished at Holy Trinity in this year of transition.

The 2014 budget developed by the Finance Committee was presented by Susan Howland.

God has answered many prayers this year. We are thankful for calling a new rector, a successful Vacation Bible school, our family worship service, relationship building with Bethlehem Lutheran Church, stewardship of our building and the goals setting. Soon there will be an opportunity for parishioners to review the list of actions that will make the goals a reality. You will be invited to join this process by indicating which actions you would like to share your stewardship and invest your time and talent in.

Our stewardship series "Flourish in Faith" has given us the opportunity to reflect on how our faith and giving are connected. We have received commitments for 79% of the dollars needed to balance our 2014 budget. ## **Consider Representing Holy Trinity at the 2014 Diocesan Convention**

On October 26, 2013, I had the privilege of representing our parish as the non-vestry lay delegate to the 122<sup>nd</sup> Convention of the Diocese of Western Massachusetts.

This all-day meeting continues to open my eyes to the fact that our congregation is part of something much larger.

That the convention, lay and clergy representing over sixty parishes met with diocesan leadership to review the diocesan budget, be introduced to new clergy, elect diocesan committee members and deputies to the 2015 General Convention, celebrate the Eucharist together, listen to Bishop Fisher's address, hear committee reports, support resolutions and most importantly - to hear the stories of God's work being done in our parishes and beyond by members of our diocese. A few examples of the exciting work include: participation in two community gardens by Grace Church in the Southern Berkshires and St. Andrew's, North Grafton, recent mission trips to the Dominican Republic and Ghana, a joint choir trip by members of All Saints, Worcester and Notre Dame Academy to northern and southern Ireland, and the work of our missionaries,

Tom and Diane Wilson in El Salvador.

Our bishop's wife, The Rev. Betsy Fisher, gave a moving presentation about her first project, to support our sister diocese in Ghana in its effort to build an instructional kitchen in a vocational training center for women in Kumasi. Our mission plate contributions in a coming month will support Betsy's project. In the meantime, if you are interested in learning more about this effort, you can read the article on the diocesan website [www.diocesewma.org](http://www.diocesewma.org). Individual contributions are encouraged.

While I have attended Diocesan Convention as your delegate many times in the past, I will not pursue that responsibility in 2014. I encourage anyone that is curious and interested to know more of what happens within the diocese and beyond to step forward and take my place. Please contact me if you have any questions. Most likely I will attend the convention, not as a voting member but as a guest. All members of the diocese are welcome to attend.
