#### **Financial Report:**

A few comments on the 2014 budget:

- Pledges are lagging behind \$2,207.36 more than anticipated, but sometimes catch up at year end.
- Overall income is at budget because the fundraising income, rental income, and plate income are over budget, and make up for other lines that are under budget.
- Overall expenses are real, but don't tell the whole story because we have enough oil for the 2014-2015 heating season, and enough reserve funds to pay the 2015 building insurance next month.
- The lines that are under budget will either be underspent, or will be put in reserve for 2015, and we have enough reserve funds to cover all budget lines if needed.
- The vestry voted to continue on with our phase three building repair plan. Next project is replacing the window in the ladies room downstairs (It has rotted out) and repair and paint the interior wall around it.
- The portico project is completed with all pledges fulfilled and a total of \$11, 735,50 donated....this
  is MORE than pledged.
- The sound system fundraiser met the asking amount with \$1,530, or \$30 over asking to date.
   We have a few more items to be replaced on the sound system.
- All bills are paid through 10.31.14

#### A few comments on the 2015 budget:

- Building insurance will go up 3%.
- Health insurance is stable.
- Clergy mid-line salary is up a little.
- Our assessment, now that we are no longer drawing endowment income which inflates the assessment, decreased by \$2,274.
- We budgeted for an increase in electricity, but not 37%. The increase will gradually go up Nov, Dec, peaking in January and then decline, so it is not a straight 37% increase.

#### 2014 Convention Notes

It was truly a privilege to attend the 2014 Convention this year as the non vestry delegate from Holy Trinity Church! There was such a positive feeling amongst the attendees. What a blessing to watch the Holy Spirit at work!

There was so much information shared about the different ministries going on around the Diocese it is tempting to write about all of them. I was struck by two ministries in particular and so I will focus on those topics and how we might tap into those more locally at HTC.

#### "Change The Babies"

This is a ministry spear-headed by the Rev. Betsy Fisher (Bishop Fisher's wife) to collect money for the Mampong Babies Home in Kumasi, Ghana. The home cares for 35 – 40 infants up to age 4 or 5 whose mothers died in childbirth. The money raised will primarily go to buy food. The government and local municipality have provided money for electricity and the babies' food and medical care in the past, but this funding has now been cut so there is a huge need for increased support. Rev. Betsy Fisher has successfully used empty fountain jugs to collect spare change in the past and is asking parish churches to adopt something similar – to collect change to "Change the Babies". Keep listening in the coming weeks for how our Family Worship children will be getting involved with this exciting ministry!

In 2013 Betsy Fisher encouraged the diocese to help raise \$30,000 to allow the Mampong Babies Home to finish a kitchen that will teach young women culinary art skills they can use to support themselves and their families. The kitchen now has a walls and a roof. They hope to have the Culinary Arts Training Facility up and running in 2015.

#### **Ecumenical Youth Group**

This topic is actually a combination of being inspired by hearing the Interim Formation Missioner, the Rev. Hilary Bogert-Winkler, talk about her work with the Youth of the Diocese, listening to the Rev. Laura Everett from the Mass. Council of Churches talk about how much binds us together across denominations, and hearing my own kids talk about "how much more fun church would be if more of their friends were there".

While the current focus of the Interim Formation Missioner is with youth that are in grades 9-12. I feel there is an opportunity for us to engage with other churches and provide a socially comfortable setting for our youth in grades 4 – 8 to be able to interact with other kids in our local faith community. Many of these children already know each other through school, sports, extra-curricular activities, etc. but because they don't go to the same specific church, may feel isolated from these friends when it comes to spiritual matters.

Can we begin collectively thinking as a parish for ways in which these children can share common ground across denominations to interact and do fun things together (bowling, sledding, skiing, mini golf, etc)? It could open some doors for further dialogue about God and Jesus and what that means to each individual amongst their peers. Potentially, this could lead to an ecumenical youth group meeting regularly and some joint local mission ventures with the children of the community working together.

I look forward to hearing the suggestions that you might have, talking with Fr Richard and the Vestry.

Thanks for the opportunity to share my take-aways from the convention and my thoughts on going forward within our parish.

#### **Stations of the Cross**

Sitting in the nave of Holy Trinity you may have noticed three new additions to the left side wall: they are the first three images of the Stations of the Cross. Fr. Richard gave Holy Trinity Church

these three pieces of liturgical art as a gift to the parish at the time of the Celebration of New Ministry when he became our Priest-in-Charge.

The Stations of the Cross are a series of scenes of Christ's sufferings and death.

They are commonly placed on the walls of the nave for people to symbolically make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem while meditating on Christ's Passion.

These Stations of the Cross are sculpted in bas-relief from an original design by Marc Fuller. Marc Fuller is an artist, sculptor, musician, and friend of Fr.

Richard's, who lives on Cape Cod.

While his artwork speaks for itself, it is interesting to note that Marc is the grandson of Meta Warrick Fuller (1877-1968), a black female artist who specialized in sculpture. In 1914 she created her signature piece, *Ethiopia Awakening*, and in 1930 her version of the Pieta. <a href="http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/">http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/</a>

Meta Vaux Warrick Fuller. In 1950 she went into retirement to care for her husband. After her husband's death she returned to

sculpture in the 1960's inspired by the civil rights movement, creating tributes like

the sculpture *Emancipation* which can be seen in the Harriet Tubman Park on Columbus Avenue in Boston, MA. http://publicartboston.com/content/emancipation

Marc's grandfather was Dr. Solomon Carter Fuller a notable Psychiatrist. Dr. Fuller spent the

majority of his career practicing at Westborough (MA) State Mental Hospital where he did ground-breaking research on the physical changes to the brains of Alzheimer's patients. The Dr. Solomon Carter Fuller Mental Health Center, a psychiatric hospital in Boston, MA, was named in his memory.

If you have not seen the three Stations take a minute to look at them up close; they are impressive and moving. There are eleven more images of the Stations of the Cross. They cost \$400 each, eight are completed with another six in progress. The vestry invites anyone who would like to help purchase additional Stations to make a donation to the Holy Trinity Memorial Fund, which can be used to purchase more Stations over time. If you would like to contribute, make your check to Holy Trinity Church with "Memorial Fund: Stations" in the memo.
