## **Senior Warden Speaking**

### **"The senior Warden's report given at the Annual Meeting on January 18<sup>th</sup> 2015**

*"I'm not going to read the report found in the Annual meeting booklet because you can read that for yourself. Fr. Richard asked me to share the following with you now."*

This time last year I stood here as your senior warden-in-charge because we had no permanent priest. Fr Richard Signore was here then, as our supply priest. Fr Richard is here now as our priest-in-charge and I stand here now as his - as your senior warden.

This time last year we had no seated organist, now Anne Bouvier-Munroe has filled that position, so together with our secretary Chris Bolte, who has been with us for 7 years as of Jan 2<sup>nd</sup> and our sexton Hector Chapa we have, for the first time in over 2 years, a full complement of staff. We look forward to a 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive year with a full complement of vestry members, two of whom are new to vestry. I feel a sense of stability and rejuvenation, I hope you do too.

This year will, like every New Year be different from last year. My senior warden role has changed – I am NO LONGER in charge – I am just senior warden. I don't have to worry about making sure we have a priest for Sunday services! I don't have to open all the mail and sort it out! Fr. Richard is offering Christian formation opportunities, empowering lay leaders and engaging us all in new worship experiences. We look forward to our first mutual ministry review with the whole parish and Fr Richard, the outcome of which will determine whether or not Fr Richard becomes our half time Rector. That is to say our half time, permanent, Rector. The position description that the vestry drew up last year, was shared via Tidings and is posted on the HTC notice board, based on half time clergy and the parish goals and objectives, it spreads the "duties" of the work of Holy Trinity church into three categories, clergy, lay leaders and congregation. It is this document that will be re-viewed in the mutual ministry review. Starting mid-year the parish will, together, look over and see how well we are following our own goals and objectives! We will, together, identify the areas that we excel in and those that need some work. We will, together, determine what should be modified and changed to keep our goals and objectives current. The mutual ministry process will be repeated yearly to ensure that we are continually refining ourselves. Through-out the forthcoming year the vestry will be referencing a diocesan recommended guideline for parish vitality to make sure we are on track. Over the last 2 years the vestry has embraced some major issues. To make sure that Holy Trinity remains viable and sustainable one issue we will embrace this year is our building. We have caught up with the "it needs to be done now" work, but we cannot get complacent - now is the time to get ahead of the game and pay attention to what we will need to do in the not too distant future and what is coming down the pike later. To be good stewards of our building, our time, our talent and our treasure we need to be proactive and intentional. A focus this year will also be to engage lay leaders and anyone else who is interested in "visioning" even "envisioning" long term plans, goals, and objectives for the

building, our ministry, our mission, and our outreach. So, as you can see, as senior warden, I am not entirely off the hook.

Last year I called to your attention the Rose window, the stained glass window at the back of the church and how like the individual pieces of glass, we as individuals are nothing special or important, but together - united in our faith, with Christ as our corner stone, we become the light of Christ sharing Gods love with the world both here, in Southbridge and the rest of the world.

This year I call to your attention the Madonna window, the window in front of us, above the altar. A stained glass back light window of a Mother and a child, of Mary and Jesus. So nicely reproduced in our Christmas schedule, flyers and posters, by Ellen Lincourt. It depicts the reason we are here, in church, today. Jesus Christ is at the center of the window – Jesus Christ is the center of our lives. Some of you may know that in correspondence I use the closing “with gratitude and blessings” and that each year I adopt a quote to put after my name. This year I have added Looking forward.... before the “with gratitude and blessings” and the quote for this year is “We can do no great things just small things with great love.” An interpretation of a quote by Mother Theresa. These words came to me in a God Moment at the end of Dec. as I was thinking about what I would say today, now. So my closing statement now reads “Looking forward....” “With gratitude and blessings” “Tamsin Lucey” “We can do no great things just small things with great love.”

Looking forward.... Looking forward to Christ in our lives today and always. Looking forward to exploring new ways to share the love of Christ with the hurting world, in our neighborhood, our community and in the wider world. Looking forward to growing our own faith, to nurturing the faith of others, to introducing Jesus Christ to those who may not even know his name. Looking forward to a year full of promise and hope. Looking forward with Gratitude and Blessings always.

We can do no great things only small things with great love. We might think that what we do each day or each Sunday is something great -something significant but we cannot do great things alone – the Great is reserved for God. It is good for us to remember that as individuals we can do no great things – **but** together and with God, the small things - the little things, done with Gods Great Love are indeed the meaningful things that allow Gods love to shine through us to a hurting world.

When we come together, looking forward, centered in Christ, with Gods Great Love, the small things we do, do make a difference, the seeds that we plant, grow.

# 2014 Treasurer's Annual Report

## Operating Budget

**Income:** overall income exceeded budget by \$12,694. Budget: \$118,461 Actual: \$ 130,566.00

Why?

- Holy Trinity Parishioners are generous!
- Fundraisers: Yard Sale; Rice-O-Rama: Pies/Bakesale, all the VBS angels. \$2,744 total over budget.
- Rental income exceeded the budgeted amount by \$2,653.
- Trust income was up by \$563, checking interest \$544; Other Plate Offering \$2,938, along with other miscellaneous unbudgeted income.

**Expenses:** overall expenses were more than budget by \$5,433, but that includes capital improvement expense of \$18,900 paid in 2014 from 2013 reserves. Budget: \$118, 461. Actual: \$123,895.

Why?

- Music was under budget by \$3,075, because we did not have a seated organist.
- Clergy was under budget by \$10,899, because we did not have a settled priest until June.
- Several other lines were under budget, some because the funds were not needed and others because of frugal spending.
- Oil is usually over budget on the report because of bulk buying, but it evens out eventually. Also because the burner booster expense is posted to the oil line. Due to the exceptionally cold 2013-2014 heating season we did need to buy additional oil.
- Other lines were intentionally over budget and were paid with reserve funds.

## Non-operating Budget

**The Non-operating Budget contains funds received that are outside of the operating budget and designated or restricted for a particular mission or purpose.**

- Contributions of \$348.49 were made for South Sudan and the Ebola Crisis and \$348.49 was sent to *Episcopal Relief and Development* for those causes.
- \$370 was sent to Childreach/PLAN to sponsor Nicholas in Kenya.
- The Good Friday Offering for the church in Jerusalem was \$139.
- The 2014 United Thank Offering was \$815.33.
- A Fitzpatrick Scholarship request was received in 2014; an award of 267.11 was given from Fitzpatrick income.
- We received memorial donations in 2014 of \$2,107; \$1,255 was designated and transferred to the Wells Music Fund.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday loose plate for Food Share was \$368.11
- The mission plate offerings were \$1,815.12, with \$1,815.122 given to various missions (Separate report)
- The Rector's discretionary fund inflow for 2014 was \$2,600, with \$3,043.55 given in alms.

## ♥Outreach Total \$12,377.27

♥\$ 5,210.56 in Parrettie requests were funded.

- The un-budgeted capital Improvements were taken from reserve 2013 funds for the cricket and major organ repair. Additionally \$1,530 was donated by parishioners to repair the sound system, which cost \$2,798.
- We received a Congregational Development grant of \$3,000 to offset the cost of the burner booster.
