A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear friends!!

Be careful! Due to a confluence of lunar cycles Ash Wednesday is so early this year (Yes! Lent will start on Feb 10th, Easter by March 27!) that if you blink, you will miss it!!!

You do not want to miss Epiphany season. Epiphany (from the Greek: Epp - ee - fan - ah - rho - thane) or "appearing," is our time to marvel and celebrate the earthly manifestations of Jesus' work in our midst. It starts with the visit of the three Kings or Magi at the crib of the Christ child proclaiming Him as: Lord (Gold); Priest (Frankincense); and Offering [for sin] (Myrrh - the ointment for burial). This shapes and defines the coming ministry of the Messiah. We go on to celebrate Jesus' teachings, moral example, healings, and compassionate reaching out to our needs. Epiphany concludes with the story of the Transfiguration on the mount; a glimpse of the return of the Resurrected Lord to reign in Glory.

Savor renewed Grace on Epiphany evening (Jan. 6th) as we share our Epiphany Potluck Agape Meal with members of Bethlehem Lutheran Church (who will later adjourn with our bible study group to continue the current shared study). We will also host the 2016 service to commemorate the week of Prayer for Christian Unity at 2:00 PM on January 24th. The Annual Meeting will be the same morning during the liturgy at 9:30. These are themselves symbolic of the companionship of Christ as we draw alongside of others to experience a larger life of Grace, as we long for the reunion of all Christians around one common altar, in a life of shared worship, ministry and service. Epiphany has things to see, and things to become; so DON'T BLINK!!!

November 2015 Financial Report

On the Income Side

- Pledges have caught up.
- Total income is over budget due to several areas: rental income, fundraising income, regular/ other plate offering, investment income, and there were designated gifts to the building fund.

On the Expense Side

- Aside from fixed expenses most of the budget lines are underspent; many only by a small amount.
- The Church repair and maintenance and capital expense are over budget and they are the most striking; much of the repair and maintenance expense was proactive repair to upgrade the church for better building utilization, and the capital expense was primarily for the undercroft ceiling, and other planned major repairs. The capital expense was reduced from \$36,312 to \$25,154.71 by the \$11,157.30 insurance payment, as that is not income, but a refund.



We still have a credit of \$3,546.91 with Tasse, but it will be used to pay the bill to fix the age old heating anomaly in the parish hall/classroom wing. The heating pipes were re-routed so now when heat is called for in the classroom zone the parish hall does not heat up; and when heat is called for in the parish hall the classroom zone does not heat up; this has been an issue and a mystery...now solved! We also installed 3 programmable thermostats in the classroom wing so the YMCA can have heat when they need it and it will go off when they do not.

The 2016 balanced budget was approved at the December 14 vestry meeting.

A year-end summary will be included with the Annual Report in January.
