Holy Trinity Church Financial Report November 2016

November 2016 Financial Report

Income

- •The pledge deficit is \$4,260 over the budgeted arrearage as expected.
- •If December holds, we will end the year with overall income over budget; the YMCA rent is not budgeted, but available for necessary repair and maintenance when needed.
- •Fundraising is over budget. If there are no outstanding receipts, the pie net is \$900. Thanks to all who worked so hard on fundraising! Next year we hope to reduce the budgeted amount for fundraising which will leave more room for designated fundraising if desired.

Expense

- •It looks like we will end the year under budget on many line items even though we went over budget by \$27,400. Most of that expense was for the capital improvements: fire alarm, roof, brick repair that was funded from reserves and from YMCA rent/donation.
- A few lines are intentionally over budget, funded from money available or set aside (Like VBS).
- •The building fund has \$1,000 and the reserve fund \$9,400.
- •There is enough money in the insurance reserve to pay the 2017 bill in full which will come in at the end of December.

Other News

- •We are waiting on some information and quotes for the downstairs kitchen renovations to bring the kitchen to health department code.
- We had some thermostat repairs, but have not received a bill yet.
- •The vestry voted a draft budget pending a few outstanding pledges.
- •As reported in October there has been significant outreach to various ministries in our community and world.


Please join me this January in raising our donation to Running Strong for American Indian Youth! Stay warm and safe, and may God bless us in our giving.
