A MESSAGE FROM THE REV. JUDITH FREEMAN CLARK

Dear friends of Holy Trinity Church,

I have to admit: I look ahead with pleasure to summer vacation with Robin and our family. To experience true leisure is a gift! But many of us (even those who are retired) have a <u>lot</u> on our plates, which means that leisure time can be difficult to locate. Like you, and like so many others, I can (and do) fall too easily under the spell of the "Tyranny of the Urgent." My vision, even when on vacation, can quickly become clouded by the specter of *too much to do and too little time in which to do it*. I have to work hard at maintaining resilience and energy, and keeping a positive outlook.

On *better* days, I work at being positive with the help of God's grace. But on <u>some</u> days I stumble along silently, feeling like a failure and hoping God will rescue me. I wish I would magically discover strength, patience, courage, enthusiasm, hope — whatever seems to be in too-short supply. And I long ago discovered that the difference between my "*better* days" and my not-so-good days is simple: it's prayer.

If I begin my day in prayer, or if I retreat into a quick prayer while I'm busy "doing" and "being," I find a place of peace, strength and love. In other words, I connect with God.

Of course, at those times when I think I'm too busy to pray, I'm <u>still</u> connected. But I'm not connected to God. Instead, I'm tied to whatever worry, pain and distraction might be uppermost in my mind. Not surprisingly, this kind of connection makes me feel worried and fragmented.

For those not in a regular habit of the practice of prayer, it <u>can</u> seem like work. If you're unaccustomed to it, prayer can seem like a duty, a chore, or even a bit of a "holy obligation."

In reality, of course prayer is none of these things. Prayer is a joyful experience that opens us to God's voice. It connects us with God's strength. Prayer is about love — it helps us maintain our relationship with God. Prayer reminds us that God is right here beside us, waiting for us to connect. As St. Augustine, Bishop of Hippo in the fourth century, tells us, God "*attends to our longing*," God has "*no cares but to take care of us*." (Augustine, *Confessions*, p. 222) This being the case, we might well ask ourselves, "Why do we stumble along, silently, hoping God might spare us a little time? Why don't we tell God what we require? Why don't we ask God to provide?" I wish I had good answers to questions like these. But I don't. There just seems to be <u>something</u> obstinate or blind in us, at times, that prevents us from seeing how much God loves us and how ready God is to give us what we so desperately need.

I commend to you the practice of prayer. Unlike any other leisure activity, prayer is the practice which can re -create and replenish us far more effectively than any vacation. Through prayer, we find our "better days" increasing (and all those other days disappearing...). This summer, in addition to enjoying time with my family and friends, my goal is to spend more leisure time with God. I hope you will find opportunities to do the same. May your "better days" grow in number through your connecting with our loving God, and may you discover a clearer pathway to peace, strength and love.



MAY FINANCIAL SUMMARY

- Income is stable at present. Expenses are \$10,000 under budget, but primarily because of the organist and clergy lines being underbudget, and the excess is being put in building and search committee funds.
- Oil is over budget because we started the year with a low tank, but there is 1400 gallons to start the next heating season and \$5,000 reserved in a fuel fund. We used 3,819 gallons in the 2012-13 heating season.
- The building insurance and workers comp insurance are prepaid through the end of the year.
- We budgeted \$500 to renew the photocopier contract, but instead we will buy our own toner and pay repair/maintenance if necessary. I would also suggest we put aside \$150 a year to purchase a new copier...their life span is now only 3 to 4 years and the cost to replace is under \$500.
- Fitzpatrick interest was re-invested (\$356.73), as there were no scholarship requests.
- The United Thank Offering ingathering money (\$304.50) was sent to the diocese. Complete financial reports can be found on the website with the Tidings, or by request.
