Dear friends!

The summer is coming upon us, a time of heat and humidity. A time that normally sees a reduction in activity, and a time in which recreation ("re-creation") is the first order. It is just as valuable as 'lying fallow' is to the natural order; just like letting the dough rest after kneading is necessary if the bread is to rise while baking. Sometime this summer, take advantage of some time for "stillness." Like when one simply appreciates the deep joy of cool, clear water when the heat is in the stratosphere.

Summer in the Undercroft 2015

Summer in the cool, cool Undercroft- doesn't sound too exciting – or does it. This summer HTEC will be a host site for the Southbridge Summer Food Service Program, July 6 through August 7. A federally funded program, administered in MA by Project Bread, strives to provide free lunches (and or breakfasts) to MA residents under the age of 18. Project Bread approached us in January of 2015 to see if we would be a site – we tentatively said yes – we hoped we could host 3 days a week.

For the last several years we have been praying that the Holy Spirit would make known to us the following: What is our mission? Why is HTEC on Hamilton St.? God doesn't mind where we worship just that we do. So: Why is HTEC here? Why is it on Hamilton Street with all the room that we have? God has arranged for us to host the Summer Free Lunch Program all 5 week days! Volunteers have come forth from 4 different churches to help us out. Not only that, we are offering 3 different programs and have help with set up and cleanup from an organization outside of the church. The programs include a summer reading program, held twice each week for 6, 7 & 8th grade Southbridge children to read their school assigned summer reading book – Out of My Mind by Sharon Draper. This program is facilitated by Bobbie Helbig, Rose Reith and Susan Grant – please pray for them. VBS is being held this year once a week on Wednesday mornings – 9 to 11:30 followed by Free Lunch. Please pray for the VBS team. You, Inc. are facilitating an Activity/Craft Program on Thursdays for grades 3 and under. Please pray for the You, Inc. team. Please pray for the HTEC Free Lunch Program volunteers - pray that God will send us lots of hungry young mouths to feed, pray that the volunteers are nourished in body and soul, and pray that we continue to be guided by the Holy Spirit. Pray that it will become clear to us that this is why HTEC is on Hamilton St – that we are called to be the Hands and Feet of Jesus, on Hamilton St, to a hurting hungry world.

Summer in the cool undercroft will be a cool, cool summer for kids in Southbridge.

Loaves and Fishes Ministry


You may have noticed there was no Loaves and Fishes Ministry news in the June Tidings. The reason why not – there was very little food donated in May to take to the food pantry, and again in June there is not much either. "So what" you may ask – "Does it matter if we support the food pantry? We do so many other things". This is absolutely true and maybe it is time to "let go" of the food pantry ministry and concentrate our efforts in areas that everyone is excited about. However, there is always a "but" and my **but** is this – collecting food for the food pantry should be a no brainer – second nature – something everyone can do. When we purchase our own groceries we can purchase 1 or 2 extra items, take them to church, and put them in the basket. There is always a need for food at the food pantries – we are always blessed with food on our tables – we thank God for our blessings and we share in our bounty. Yes, we share that bounty in different ways, but I find myself coming back to this bible passage over and over again: "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." I think that people just forget – they like the idea, they mean to take a grocery bag and a list at the beginning of the month and buy some extra food, bring it back to church and put it in the basket, but they just forget to do so – so much else going on in their lives. 


