Holy Trinity Church Financial Report May 2016

On the income side

Pledges are behind \$2,328 over the budgeted arrearage of \$2,208 after correcting for pre-paid pledges. This is improved from last month.

Overall the other lines are within budget. Fundraising tends to happen in the 2nd half of the year.

On the expense side

- All expense lines are within budget with these exceptions:
 - Line 5302 · Church, Capital Improvement. This line shows the Fire Alarm expense, but it is being paid by funds donated by the YMCA.
 - Line 5301 · Church Repair/Maintenance is over budget; some of these expenses may be recovered from the YMCA rental as they were necessary for the rental.
 - Line 5203 · Utilities- Electric Church is over budget and is a direct result of the YMCA rental.
- There are several lines under budget, notably:
 - The Clergy reimbursables and clergy supply as Fr. Richard has not taken vacation in 2016.
 - Insurance is paid once a year and reserved monthly, so the line will look under budget.
 - Oil is under budget, but money is put away monthly for large purchases. There is enough oil in the tank for most of the 2016-2017 season.
 - We have an outstanding bill for minor organ repair, and the major repair is scheduled to be done in June.

The Fire Alarm motion passed unanimously by email vote on May 17, 2016. The bid from Alternative Telecommunications was \$29, 338.44 total, \$10, 715.20 upstairs, \$18,623.24 downstairs. YMCA portion \$9,311.62, HTC Portion \$20,026.82.


HTEC Community Yard Sale Saturday, August 20 9:00 am to 2:00 pm Rain or Shine

COMMUNITY GARDEN SUMMER MONTHS!

God was and is with us – all the way! It rained before and after, but NOT during, both Community Gardening events! Father Richard was on hand to bless gardens outside the church, at Cross Street and Worcester Street – Thank you Fr. Richard for making the time to travel to Southbridge 2 Saturdays in a row! All 3 events – container gardens at the front of the church, and community plots at Cross Street and Worcester Street were wonderful successes. Thank you to all the Holy Trinity folk that came and lent a hand – couldn't have managed without you. Hard work but lots of fun and well worth the effort! Several neighbors came and planted in containers that were then trundled home in wheelbarrows! We have;



tomatoes, beans, peppers, cucumbers and lettuce growing in straw bales in front of the Parish Hall, and wooden crates on the steps to the Foyer, plus sunflowers and delphiniums growing in containers in front of the Church! The Community Plots at Cross Street and Worcester Street are full of assorted vegetables and herbs. Straw bales and wooden crates are planted with watermelons, butternut squash, tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, summer squash and zucchini. Community neighbors are

watering their own plots, the straw bales, wooden crates and even the grass and flower beds in front of the Church! We encourage folks to check in on the progress of the vegetables and pick produce as it is ready. AND if you see Idamaris Rivera watering the plants in front of the church one evening – *please* introduce yourself, say hello, and thank her!

These activities continue to give us opportunities to engage in conversation with our neighbors; we can get to know each other better as we become known as the Face, Hands and Feet of Jesus on Hamilton St. as we are called to be a presence on Hamilton Street and in this neighborhood.
