A MESSAGE FROM THE REV. JUDITH FREEMAN CLARK

Dear Holy Trinity Church friends,

*"Holy Spirit, ever working through the Church's ministry;
quickenning, strengthening and absolving, setting captive sinners free..."*

a line from *Hymn #511*, Timothy Rees (1874-1939)

We now enter the portion of the Christian year that once was referred to as "Ordinary Time." But this longest stretch of the Church calendar between Easter and Advent is now (encouragingly) known as the "Season of Pentecost." We sing in Hymn #511 about the Church's ministry, which recognizes us as a diverse, inclusive community, one that is always working. We are a human community — one that makes mistakes, yet is forgiven, one that can at times be weak, but is ever-strengthened by God's Holy Spirit. God has created each of us, and continues to re-create us constantly, as individuals with special interests, gifts, and talents.

So during this Season of Pentecost, as followers of Jesus we face many questions about the tasks and goals before us which draw on those gifts and capabilities.

"Who does God invite us to be here in Southbridge and the surrounding community?"

"How can we discover healthful, life-sustaining ways to 'work in the Holy Spirit'?"

"Where is the place where our deepest joys and the world's greatest needs intersect?"

In the coming months, will we live into the truth shared in the first letter of John, "God is light and in him there is no darkness at all"? Another of our questions might be

"How can we share the light of God with others in authentic, appropriate and respectful ways?"

Throughout the recent season of Easter, the Gospel appointed for each Sunday was from John. There is a strong and characteristic image in all Johannine literature (*The Gospel According to John*, and the three *Letters of John*); that "God is light." This is a metaphor, a way to describe the mystery and love we experience when we encounter our Creator. When we say "in God *there is no darkness at all*," we affirm that God loves each one of us unconditionally. We say that God's light shines throughout all Creation — no exceptions.

When we encounter this truth during worship, I hope we feel a sense of goodwill and peace. But how do we translate these "good feelings about God" so the world may benefit? What moves us from a static faith, in which we say we "believe in God" to a dynamic faith in which we live into our belief?

One way is by becoming more intentional about hospitality. In particular, we do this by reaching out to people who may be unfamiliar with Holy Trinity Church, or those for whom worshipping in the Episcopal Church may be a new experience. By issuing invitations, by making people feel accepted and welcome even before they walk through the doors of our church building, we share our conviction about God's unconditional love for all people, without exception.

All this is fairly easy to implement; we only need to consider what will make people feel comfortable and accepted — and then do it! Often, people who attend a casual event, or a one-shot church activity or program, are prompted to return on a Sunday morning. At Holy Trinity Church, we have several upcoming opportunities on our calendar which are perfect for issuing invitations to others— the parish's Community Yard Sale (Saturday, 6/8), the Ladies Luncheon (6/23) another is Vacation Bible School (8/5 through 8/9). There are others, as well, including the Tuesday night "Gathering on Hamilton St.," and our wonderful Family Worship Sundays" (more info about these are included elsewhere in this issue of *Tidings*).

Regular Sunday morning worship is important, yet our response to the light that is God cannot stop on Sunday mornings if we expect the parish to stabilize and grow. Think about why you are a member of this faith community. What is it about Holy Trinity Church that draws you here and keeps you here? Where does your joy meet the world's deepest need? God needs us — God invites and urges us — to share the light of God's love with others, everywhere. We are each given the great privilege of opening our doors and our hearts so others can experience the light of God's love shining so brilliantly at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Southbridge.

Holy Trinity Church 2013 Financial Figures through 4-30-13

Budgeted income through 4/30/13: \$42,702.06 ; amount received \$45,500.46

Budgeted expense through 4/30/13: \$42,530.69; actual expense \$32,708.77

On the income side nothing out of the ordinary to report. All excess income is being put in a reserve account quarterly for building repairs and search committee.

On the expense side the Christian Ed budgets are under budget. The insurance and workers comp are paid through the end of the year avoiding \$50 in finance charges. There are open invoices for oil of \$3,480, and electrical repair of \$1,200, which will be paid in May.

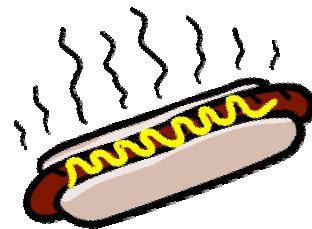
