Dear friends,

We are glad to see some interesting ministry opportunities beginning to form at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. We were sought out for our location. These are in the "formative" stages and a few pieces need to drop into place for them to take flight, and yet are well within reach. There is an initiative to create a neighborhood safe-space in which young teens can have supervised activities and learning experiences - and just plain fun! But this needs to take place off the street, away from the abrasive violence, and destructive behaviors often found there. This initiative is called the "Clubhouse." A funding grant-request is pending, if successful these funds would be used to establish and grow the initiative. The initiative will go ahead even if the grant is not successful it will just take longer to get going. Either way this initiative will be staffed. Another, separate, but related project will be for us to be a location for the Project Bread Summer Food Service Lunch Program. We hope to staff this two days a week with volunteers from HTEC; and if the volunteers are available from HTEC and local churches, add other weekdays. Other local organizations are interested in facilitating activities for children to engage in as well as lunch. Details to follow!!!

FINANCIAL REPORT

Income

If we look at the total income minus the pre-paid pledges we are exactly on budget. But, there are many variances within the income lines:

- The quarterly trust income just came in; it is over budget, but it will be applied for 2 more months.
- There is some un-budgeted income for coffee, interest and flowers.
- The rental income is way over budget.
- Pledges are down \$5,000, or about \$4,000 over budget.

Expenses

Expenses overall are about \$2,000 under budget despite the oil purchase, which should last us for the 2015-16 heating season.

A few thing of note:

- Our long term rental for Tai Chi stopped the end of April.
- The usual reserves for oil and insurance were transferred keeping the available checking balance at \$10,000.
- As of May 3rd we used 4,377 gallons of oil for the 2014-15 heating season. Last year on May 7th we had used 3,928.5 gallons, so the cold winter cost us an extra 448.5.
- Our investments as of the 3.31.15 have appreciated by \$4,830.
- The building repair reserve is now at \$6,692.71, with an outstanding bill for the exterior window replacement and ladies room repairs of \$2,430.
- The vestry is working on a long-range plan for building repair needs to ensure we are able to use our building for mission and ministry.
- \$79.00 was sent to Food Share so far this year.
- The Souper Bowl fundraiser raised \$200 for Food Share.
- \$163.20 went to various outreach ministries through mission plate donations.
- We have full funding for our sponsor child to date.
