A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Friends.

We opened the question of an "Easter Spirituality" by asking you to leave the dark places and move toward rejoicing. One can "Rock with God" through your favorite music, or by engaging in the adventurous activity that opens a sense of wonder. The Gospels 'keynote' the teaching of the Church. In this season of Easter these texts have asked us to synch-up our emotional faith and our intellectual assent (Doubting Thomas); to seek the Living God in Holy Scripture and Holy Sacrament ("Emmaus Road" resurrection appearance); to follow the voice of Jesus within: understood as 'conscience' and/or inspiration (Christ the Good Shepherd); and to believe with a child-like simplicity that Jesus reigns to support and hold us ("I am the way, the truth, and the life..."). For the remaining Sundays in the season, we honor God in Creation; and wait for the Holy Spirit to claim us for God.

I have often thought that people are happiest when they are learning and growing; alternatively we become bored and disengaged. Easter Spirituality can be typified in the desire to know God, and to seek God in the simple things of life. We never cease expecting a miracle. We know asking in prayer comes before recognizing God's answer. Life's Joy leads us back to the Giver, the Risen Christ, and so the inspiration leads to new growth. He is Risen; and it is glorious in our eyes!

WHAT IS THE MEANING OF PENTECOST?

The term means "the fiftieth day." It is used in both the OT and the NT. In the OT it refers to a feast of seven weeks known as the Feast of Weeks. It was apparently an agricultural event that focused on the harvesting of first fruits. Josephus referred to Pentecost as the fiftieth day after the first day of Passover. The term is used in the NT to refer to the coming of the Spirit on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1), shortly after Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension. Christians came to understand the meaning of Pentecost in terms of the gift of the Spirit. The Pentecost event was the fulfillment of a promise which Jesus gave concerning the return of the Holy Spirit. The speaking in tongues, which was a major effect of having received the Spirit, is interpreted by some to symbolize the church's worldwide preaching. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is now the seventh Sunday after Easter. It emphasizes that the church is understood as the body of Christ which is drawn together and given life by the Holy Spirit. Some understand Pentecost to be the origin and sending out of the church into the world. www.Episcopalchurch.org
