

 Overall income is over budget. This is due to receiving \$1,272.00 from last year's pledge, prepaid pledges, and some unbudgeted income. It is too early in the year to comment more.

Expense Side

- The Church repair and maintenance line is over budget, mainly due to snow removal.
- The Church capital improvement line is over budget because of necessary electrical upgrades for fire code compliance.
- The usual reserves have been put aside for the bulk oil purchases and annual insurance bill.
- The utility bills will come in over budget going forward because of the YMCA. This expense was factored into the rent, but not into the budget, as this is a short term rental.
- The finances are in good shape.
