A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear friends,

I often troubled my teachers at seminary, asking "We are so devoted to discipline and rigorous practice of faith during Lent and penitential seasons; but why do we not have more to say about 'living in the power of the Resurrection'?"

Well, the first answer is 'that should be our "default setting;" ' (the normal Christian life of Thanksgiving). It is also true that weight of loss and struggle is often what sets apart the truly happy and blessed moments; and only that contrast allows us to see them for the richness they convey!

Keeping this in mind, this Easter season we have introduced into our Sunday liturgy some new "frames of reference" to help contrast and define some nuances in this glorious resurrection life we share in the Risen Christ. The life of the Risen Christ as lived through the work of the Church and the faithful will be emphasized through alternative forms of the Prayers of the People (to set out the variety and power of passionate response to the Gospel imperative;) while the Eucharistic Prayer will develop our sense of the gentle nurture inherent in the image of Christ our mother (sic; Dame Julian of Norwich et al). Oh, how Anglican!! :)

Have they been met or have we fallen short? Should new goals and objectives be made, should some stay the same? This year's Mutual Ministry Review will also consider whether Fr. Members of the congregation have shared that they like the altar where it is now so it is staying "up front".

I mentioned, last month, new beginning - you will find information in this Tidings about a new beginning that is coming to Holy Trinity Episcopal Church – The Club House. We pray that you will agree this new beginning is a perfect opportunity to share our building, extend our hospitality and to be the Hands and Feet of Jesus on Hamilton Street.

Please know that there are plans in place to repair the bottom step to the foyer stairs, currently roped off, so everyone is using the ramp. It has recently been decided that these repairs should be combined with much needed repairs to brick work at the front of the church. The brick work to the left of the foyer door received extensive damage during the melting snow and ice season caused by cascading water from the flat foyer roof. We pray that these repairs will be completed soon.

As always - please remember in your prayers: Fr. Richard, Nina and their family, all the Lay Leaders and those involved in ministry at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, pray for each other, the Hamilton Street neighborhood and the communities that we live in.

THE CLUB HOUSE

In the fall of 2014, Fr. Richard and I were approached by Lynne Simonds about the possibility of the undercroft and classrooms being used as a place for middle school (6, 7 & 8) children in Southbridge to come and have a place they could call their own – a Club House. Fr. Richard and I recently submitted a letter of intent to apply for a grant from the Health Foundation of Central Massachusetts to help get the Club House project started. We will find out in late May if we will be invited to apply for a grant. Either way – The Club House will slowly but surely take shape and come into being sometime later this year. The Club House hours will be mutually determined to work with current and anticipated use of the undercroft and classrooms. Currently Lynne Simonds is working with Southbridge Middle School, the Jacobs Edwards Library, Harrington Hospital, The Center of Hope, The Family Health Center and The George Wells Human Health Center to put together partnerships and programs for The Club House. The Club House will be run by staff, volunteers and high school mentors, using their own funds and paying us rent. Expect to see more information about the Club House soon. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to speak with me.

PENTECOST SUNDAY, MAY 24



The first Christian celebration of Pentecost happened in Jerusalem. The disciples spoke in native languages that could be understood by visitors from far off lands. Pentecost is celebrated now at HTEC with people reading the Acts Chapter 2 verses 2 to 21 in different languages all at the same time. This year join us in the sanctuary at 9:30 a.m. on May 24 as we celebrate Pentecost and hear the scripture read in Modern Greek, Dutch, Russian, Swahili, French (Canadian) Spanish

(Southbridge dialect), English (British), English (American), and from The Message. If you would like to take part using another language please let Fr. Richard or Tamsin Lucey now, the more languages the better!

March Financial Report On the income side:

- Pledges are down by \$3,322 over budget. We have \$10,000 in prepaid pledges so the pledge line is "artificially" over budget.
- Fundraising is under budget.
- Rental income is over budget.

Overall income is down \$7,200 after adjusting for the prepaid pledges.

On the expense side:

- Most lines are under budget except for salary and utilities. The oil and insurance will vary as
 they are paid once or twice a year, but money is put in reserve for these expenses.
- Church repair and maintenance is way over budget: the snow shoveling alone was \$2,022.50 with \$550 coming from 2014, and therefore reserve funds.
- Expenses are down ~ 5,000 which makes the cash flow about even.
- We have not yet been billed for the window and bathroom work done by Cole Contracting,
 \$2,300 but the money is in reserve. We will also have an expense for the gutters and the front stairs soon.

Non Operating Budget

1st Q Foodshare and March Mission and Outreach collection will be sent in April.

Summary

- The Statement of Financial Position, however, looks good, and we are optimistic pledges will catch up.
- Money was moved into the Fuel Fund and the Insurance Fund and into the reserve fund to be used for budget lines under spent going forward.
- The very good news is that as of 3/18/15 we only used 200 gallons of oil over last year at that date, and it was a brutally cold winter.
- We bought 4000 gallons of oil at \$2.395/gallon delivered on 3.31.15 (Paid in April) for \$9, 581.44, so we will have almost enough oil for the 2015-2016 heating season.
