The End of the Burner Booster Era


Two years ago we entered into an agreement with Tasse Fuel to install a "Burner Booster", which they guaranteed would save us 15% on our heating bill, along with a cleaner, environmentally friendly, burn. This was cutting edge technology, and we believe we did save the 15% over the two years, despite some "technical difficulties". We also applied for and received a congregational development grant of \$3,000 to help offset the cost of the equipment.

Unfortunately, the Burner Booster Company went out of business because the invertor became ill. The equipment has been removed and Tasse honored our contract. We invested \$9,000, saved approximately \$3,000 in oil and we have a \$4,500 credit at Tasse to be used for oil or repairs. We contacted the diocese about returning the grant money and they said we do not need to return the money.

As compensation for the broken contract the big steam boiler has a brand new burner, as the old one was converted and could not be reversed; the small boiler had its previous burner restored and both boilers have been cleaned at no cost to us.

This was an adventure into improving energy stewardship; we will continue to be good stewards of our heating system and conserve fuel when possible by programming thermostats.

BIG THANKS TO OUR LAWN CARE GUYS!!!!



Undercroft Ceiling Repair

As we age, our bodies need more care, sometimes major repairs, and, at other times, just a bit of tuning. The same is true with our building. In fact, we will be commemorating the church building's sesquicentennial in 2019. That's 150 years; can you imagine?

For various reasons, Holy Trinity Church is a special place to all of us, as it has been for many people over the years. Right now it needs some serious TLC. We have taken on an extensive ceiling repair in the undercroft, keeping in mind our mission to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ on Hamilton Street.

Cole Contracting has removed and disposed of all layers of the plaster ceiling and the drop ceiling grid and tiles. Electrical wiring, lighting, and fire detection issues have been resolved, and new ceiling grid and tiles have been installed.

The estimated cost of \$18,450 will draw down to zero all of our available reserve funds, but the vestry voted to go forward with the project because our life and purpose is centered in this community of Southbridge.

As our congregation collectively prepares to celebrate the church building's 150 years, we are also preparing and repairing our building so that our children, grandchildren and generations to follow can experience the specialness of Holy Trinity Church. We will continue to honor our budget while working to restore all reserve funds.

Several people have asked what they can do to help. If you would like to help replenish our building fund, please talk with Susan Howland or any vestry member.

THE MISSION PLATE

Financial Update: end of 3rd Quarter 2015.

On the income side:

Pledges are down \$2,500 over budget after correcting for per-paid pledges. Rental and fundraising are somewhat over budget. All other lines are within expected limits.

On the expense side

Many lines are under budget, but can most likely be accommodated over the next 3 months until the end of this fiscal year.

Other financial comments

Equipment: money was set aside in an equipment fund last year and this year. A lawn mower was purchased for \$400; it is a very sturdy, self propelled mower that should give us years of use for our "all volunteer" team of lawn care specialists!!! We are researching a floor polisher that Hector suggested. A new hot water heater was installed because the old one was leaking; Gordon Plumbing traced down the water lines and all is in order.

Building Inspection Certificates: the emergency lighting was completed to obtain our new building inspection certificates, which have been issued.

Heat: The Burner Boosters were removed. (See separate article in this Tidings.) The Boilers have been restored to their original condition. There is a new burner on the large boiler and a rebuilt burner on the small boiler. The heat was tested and is working. There are now 7,000 gallons of oil in the tank. We still have a credit with Tasse of \$3,546.91. We will need to change the classroom wing thermostats to programmable and track down the heating valve issues in that space.

YMCA Lease: the executive and finance committees worked on a lease agreement with the YMCA which is acceptable to all. The YMCA is waiting on state site inspections before the lease agreement can be finalized.

Undercroft Ceiling Restoration: the undercroft ceiling restoration is well underway. The drop ceiling and two layers of old ceiling plaster have been removed along with about 1/3 of the electrical wiring that was old and useless. Seven fire protection heat sensors were replaced and rewired, and a new drop ceiling will be installed. Our estimate to date is \$18,450. At an emergency vestry meeting we unanimously agreed that the available reserve funds should be put into the Building Fund to start to pay for the undercroft ceiling bill.
