## A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

### Dear friends,

We have come to the final phase of the Church year! Starting from October 4<sup>th</sup>, the festival of St Francis (who exalted creation) – and through the end of the Church Year on November 23<sup>rd</sup>, (Christ the King - reigning in glory in heaven). This time is also recognized as a call to us, for a renewed emphasis on the "integrity of Creation;" and our care for the great gift of the earth. This is well in keeping with the normative thrust of the end of the Church year, which is about harvests of souls and harvests of crops. Think: Thanksgiving, the ingathering of crops before the winter, the ingathering of souls on All Saints day and the "final endless banquet" in heaven where Christ reigns as King, bringing justice.

The annual Parish "Stewardship ingathering" is also part of the season, as the joyful appreciation for the bounty of God that touches our lives, and mirrors the celebration of souls gone to God that also reflects with gladness on the ultimate end of all believers: to be harvested by the Lord!



## **Financial Report**

## On the income side

Although the overall income is more than budget the unpaid pledges are \$2700 over anticipated. Over budget income is primarily from other plate income, fundraising, and rental income. Parishioners and others have been very generous toward the mission plate, the sound system, and vacation bible school designated fundraising.

## On the Expense side

We are about \$2,000 under budget, which includes some intentional spending for expenses for capital building repair/improvements. The cricket and gutter bills were paid. As we start the fall we have:

- Purchased and paid for 2800 gallons of oil; we will have another bill for the balance of 1000 gallons of oil.
- Put in reserve the maintenance contract cost and the burner booster funds.
- Paid for the sound system, with more repairs to be completed.
- Fixed the heating system, but the bill has not been paid yet.

It is the time of the year when the finance committee and vestry start to draft the 2015 budget. We are looking at a near level-funded budget in the hope that pledges will remain steady. This will allow any increase in pledges to be put to proactive unbudgeted capital repairs and other program initia-tives.

If you have one of those amazing peel/core devices, it would be most welcome TODAY!! Also, we'll be prepping the pumpkins, roasting and preparing the pulp for the pumpkin pies.

On Sunday, October 5<sup>th</sup>, we will kick off our annual giving campaign: "Walking the Way."

The finance committee met on Tuesday, September 16, 2014 to discern the proposed 2015 budget. We will be in intentional prayer to letting the Holy Spirit lead and guide us in a faithful response.

We will pray that your giving will come from a deep abiding sense of gratitude for the gift of this community and the gift we have in Jesus, the one who does not leave our side in our walk of faith. My own walk is deepened when I give not from a perspective of "what is my fair share," or even, "what can I afford"; rather, my faith comes alive when I give from a grace-filled and grateful heart. Giving generously gives me strength and hope for the journey ahead.
