The Vestry met on September 9, 2012

- We accepted a letter of resignation from Ray Gustafson with regret.
- We certified a Lay Eucharistic Minister license for Joe DiSalvatore.
- We accepted the resignation of Mary Hicks from the Parrettie Committee and the committee will be discerning two new committee members.
- Family Church will start on September 23rd. The Parish Hall has been redesigned with the ability to divide up the space using curtains that are easily pushed back when not needed. Lana and Cat went for training on the Family Church curriculum.

- We purchased about 2600 gallons of oil at \$3.35 a gallon; this should get us into January.

A MOMENT WITH MISSIONS

Our most recent challenge has been to raise \$500 for Farms International, Inc., a Christian mission which assists people in eleven developing countries to start new businesses by granting them interest-free small loans, thus enabling them to support themselves. They are expected to give a tithe to their church from their earnings and to repay the loan as they are able so others may be assisted. (Please look up www.farmsinternational.com.) As of September 9th, \$424.44 had been given.

Our next endeavor is to support the Fall Project of our local Ecumenical Fellowship Community. For many years, the EFC has done the Crop Walk, but Eileen DeMings reports that this year they decided to do something different, namely, raise funds for the Church World Service "Blankets+" program. We will give to this through the Missions Plate and as the Missions Project of our new monthly Family Church. Just \$25 can provide five warm blankets for a family left homeless by an earthquake or other disaster. Prayerfully consider your response. Can you think of any reason why we can't raise enough money for 200 blankets by Christmas (=\$1,000)?!?

The Missions Plate is located at the front of the church. Gifts may be given during Holy Eucharist. The total Missions plate giving to September 9th was \$2,382.44 or \$64.39/wk. for the first 37 weeks of 2012. \$1,958 had been disbursed.
