SENIOR WARDEN SPEAKING

First, the big news: The Vestry has unanimously voted to accept the Search Committee's recommendation to call Father Richard Signore as our next priest. Until Father Richard starts permanently as our half-time priest in the Spring of 2014, he will be our supply priest for October, November, Christmas Eve, January and February. This will allow Father Richard to take the time he needs before he assumes his role as Holy Trinity's permanent half-time priest. As our regular supply priest, Father Richard will provide pastoral oversight and begin to engage with the parish, learning more about who we are and what we do. It is true that this next stage of the transition is a little unusual, but then we have to agree that it has been most unusual up to now as well. We knew calling a half time priest would mean changes and flexibility on our part and for the priest. Father Richard, the vestry and I believe that this will work, there are mutual advantages, and that it is part of God's promised and preferred plan for us. We will use other supply priests and Morning Prayer for September, December and March. As we move forward together in Love and Faith and as information becomes available, I will keep you updated.

Onto other news, the sale of the rectory. At the beginning of August we accepted an offer and started proceedings, as it stands now it looks like the sale of the rectory will happen in mid Sept. Please keep those involved in this process in your prayers.

Everyone reading this should have received a letter about and commitment card for the Portico & Column Restoration and Repair Fund. The vestry decided at the August meeting that it is important for us to continue with the repairs and maintenance of the church building. The Portico - the canopy at the entrance to the church door – has been there since the church was first built. It is part of what identifies this building as Holy Trinity Church; the vestry feels very strongly that it should remain so. The columns at the entrance of the foyer and parish hall likewise help identify this building as Holy Trinity Church. We pray that you will contribute to the restoration and repair fund as you are able. If you have any questions please see a member of the vestry or myself.

Lastly, with regard to the building, the vestry has approved the installation of Booster Burners to both the oil fired boilers – these will save the church fuel and therefore money. The cost of this installation is covered by the savings in fuel.

I hope that everyone is aware that Holy Trinity Church has a Web page and a Facebook page. We use these as a means of communication to the parish and to the community as a whole. I encourage you to refer to them frequently, get advance notice of what is happening, follow the count down to the next church event, follow the link to Rich Simpson's blog which contains the sermon he preached here at HTC on August 18th also a link to the Bishop's blog also very interesting reading. LOAVES AND FISHES MINISTRY

At the end of August, **one** bag of food was dropped off at the Blessed John Paul II food pantry. There are times when I wonder if this ministry is something that parishioners feel we should continue or not. I very often, in fact all the time, ask God for signs – should I do this or do that. I have been asking lately if we should continue this ministry, providing food for the local food pantry, or concentrate our efforts elsewhere. Now I am again **asking this question**, but this time **to the parish**. Please let me know if we should continue to collect food for the food pantry. Of course, if there is food or not in the basket at the end of the month, that will also be an answer. Each month, we have the opportunity to come **together** each with a “loaf or fish” and collectively provide food that comprises a meal; protein, veg, starch, fruit, milk and juice. The salad recipes are posted on the board and will be at the back of the church on Sunday, September 8 through September 22. Please take one or two, bring the food, and place it in the basket before Sunday, September 29 when it will be blessed. If you have any questions please let me know.

Financial Summary as of July 31, 2013

Income: is right at budget after adjusting for a special donation to a flower fund. Current year pledge is underpaid by \$3,393, the figure is an average of overpaid, paid-up, and pledges in arrears and is offset by increase in plate income and paid up last years pledges. Rental income is down.

Expense: Many lines are under budget, some because they are seasonal or once a year and have not been expended yet. As reported before, the clergy and organist expense line excess is set aside in funds for the search committee, a fuel fund, and building reserve, and we have paid the upfront costs of selling the rectory.

I would point you to the statement of financial position to see how the large bank balance is divided up. The fuel funds stands at \$8,000, but we will buy a large quantity of oil soon, The search committee fund, minus some small distributions, will roll back into the general fund now that we have called Fr. Richard; and the building reserve fund will be lowered when we pay the \$6,835 bill for work done and not paid at the time of this report.

There is enough free cash in the checking account to pay for the budgeted lines as expenses come in.



FAMILY WORSHIP NEWS

Family Worship is going strong here at HTC. This past month included two special services. The first was a Family Service on August 11, 2013, where we wrapped up our weeklong VBS camp. We processed into “big church” with special crosses and then sat with Father Richard for a children’s sermon about finding that special God song when you need it. The children made a musical offering of two of their favorite VBS songs and all were able to join in to make a joyful noise.

On August 25, 2013 we had a “Blessing of the Backpacks” service. Children of ALL ages (college included!) were invited to bring in their school bags to be blessed at the Holy Eucharist. While the congregation received their scripture and Gospel lessons, we had a lesson on “what’s in your backpack”- we shared that God is always with you, even at school and Our Lord is in your heart and in your backpack!

We will continue our Family Worship Service this fall. If you are new to Holy Trinity, here is how it works:

Service begins at 9 am (through September, please be advised this may change!). Families sit together in the sanctuary, or “big church” as we affectionately call it. After saying the Collect together, the priest dismisses families to the Parish Hall. We have our own kid friendly service that involves a Gospel lesson and activity. Using our own altar “children’s chapel” is included where we say our prayers, recite the Nicene Creed and confess our wrong-doings. Families are then received back into the sanctuary for the Holy Eucharist.
