I am thankful for the Mutual Ministry Review taking time to look back over the last year and celebrate our successes. The review was certainly a positive experience. We discussed how we can move forward in mission together at Holy Trinity.

At the vestry meeting in December we were planning the Agape Epiphany Supper and following the Mutual Ministry review we wanted to reach out to the community. It was suggested to change the name to the Festival of Kings: Fiesta de Reyes to be more welcoming to our neighbors. In case you are wondering when you see the advertising for the Epiphany supper.

Lastly, I would like to thank the family worship team for all the hard work preparing the children for an exceptional pageant "Heaven and Nature Sing". In addition, thank you to the parents who must have practiced at home for many hours. The play had plenty of biblical content with a little comedy. Blakely Hall was filled with family and parishioners that enjoyed cookies and hot cocoa following the performance. Thank you to the children who worked very hard and delivered their lines perfectly we have many gifted actors and actresses. Thank you for sharing your gifts with the parish.

#### **November Financial Report**

#### Income

- Please refer to the budget vs actual and statement of financial position for details.
- The pledge line is close to budget correcting for the last of the prepaid reserve.

#### **Expense**

- We have some under budget lines.
- Insurance held all year will be paid in December when we get the 2018 bill.
- Oil will come in a little under budget with a good amount of oil in the tank.
- Utilities: All are over budget and we will need to reassess when thinking about rental fees.
- Despite the increase in hourly wage for the sexton, we will be a little under budget because of the two staff changes and the delay in hiring a new sexton.
- The secretary line will go under budget because Chris cut back her hours for the summer from 9 to 6.
- Clergy reimbursables will be under budget.
- The clergy sabbatical and continuing ed budget will be in the reserve fund at year end. You can see the Clergy sabbatical & CE Fund on the statement of financial position. Please talk to me if you want more information on this Fund.

#### **Miscellaneous Items**

- **Kitchen update:** \$21,911 spent to date offset by the grant of \$6,625.
- **Prayer Books update** \$450 spent; \$345 donated.
- A note on the rental money from the YMCA. It was the decision of the Finance Committee and Vestry that these funds, minus the cost incurred by the rental and 15% tithed to Mission and Outreach (\$4,095.00), will be put into a "Holy Trinity Savings Fund" and not put toward the operating budget. For healthy church finances our Operating Budget must be sustained by pledges, designated or other gifts, and designated trust income. The "Holy Trinity Savings Fund" can be used for capital repairs over and above the budgeted amount and special projects/initiatives.
- Computer update: The new computer was purchased and John Grant set it up and transferred the files; the new computer is networked to the old computer in case there were lingering files than need to be accessed. Chris is now working on the new computer.
  - o Office 365 is installed through the "seat" on Fr. Richard's laptop (Gifted from my subscription) Eventually we will apply for a free license through Microsoft.
  - o We purchased a 3-seat license for QuickBooks 2018 and that is installed.
