



SR. WARDEN NEWS

Dear Parishioners;

It's with great humility that I've accepted the position of Senior Warden. Your trust has moved and inspired me. Although, I have some uncertainty as to my abilities and skills, I know that I can rely on past Senior Wardens, for assistance, advice, and counsel. Nancy Waugh has left the Vestry in excellent condition, as did Tamsin Lucey and all the others that came before them.

Our vestry is a committee with a range of invaluable skill sets, varied personalities, and most importantly a deep faith. I am deeply impressed as to how, after lively discussions and pointed questions, consensus is reached, with all moving together. I believe that this is a testament to our shared faith.

I start this position after having served as Junior Warden for the past two years and as a vestry member for two years before that. To think, I was accepted into the Episcopal Church a little more than five years ago, after having attended at my dear wife's, Susan's, side for five years prior.

The congregation of this parish, everyone from the established members to the young families, leaves me in awe. Our congregation is generous and kind. We are blessed with talented and loving people with whom we share the pews every Sunday.

HOLY TRINITY TREASURER'S REPORT 2017

Operating Budget

Income: overall income exceeded budget by \$14,542. Budget: \$125,301; Actual: \$ 139,843, after adjusting for prepaid 2018 pledges. Why?

- •Fundraisers: \$189 over budget
- •Rental income over budget by \$1,550
- •Plate offering over budget by \$3,767
- •Prayer Book dedication gifts of \$430
- •Pledges were \$1,295 over budget with no arrearage, which was budgeted at \$4,400
- •Checking interest \$199 over budget
- •Other miscellaneous unbudgeted income

•Trust income was up by \$701. ½ of that was because we started taking distributions from the Legacy Fund, which has restricted use: "Distributions from the fund therefore shall be limited to: (i) capital improvements of the PARISH; (ii) outreach ministries and grants; (iii) seed money for new ministries and special one-time projects;".

Expenses: overall expenses were over budget by \$4,626. Budget: \$125,301; Actual: \$129,927 Why?

The capital improvement line is intentionally over budget as we moved ahead with the unbudgeted Kitchen renovation for a cost of \$21,911, which was offset by a Ministry Development Grant of \$6,625 from the diocese.
Oil was close to budget, but money is put into the fuel fund reserve monthly because we have a large oil tank and we can take advantage of buying oil in bulk at a lower price.

•After vestry consideration, all lines over budget were paid for with reserve funds and income over budget.

•Many lines were under budget, some because funds were not needed and others because of frugal spending, which offset the overbudget lines.

Non-operating Budget

The non-operating budget contains un-budgeted funds received and designated or restricted for a particular mission or purpose.

•We received \$2,640 in donations to the **Holy Trinity Building Fund** in honor of Joe DiSalvatore's 60th birthday.

•A gift of \$50 was given to the **Holy Trinity Organ Fund**, a fund for maintenance and repairs.

•The net Income from the YMCA rental of \$16,950 (In addition to prior years rent in reserve) is now in the new Holy Trinity Savings Fund. 10% of the net income was put into a Mission Fund. See * below.

Memorials

•We received memorial donations in 2017 of \$765; most of this was given in celebration of Fr. Richard's 40th anniversary of ordination; \$500 was spent to purchase one station of the cross.

•We received a \$10, 037.86 memorial gift of life insurance from The Rev. John Miller, former rector of Holy Trinity Church. This windfall gift was put in the **Legacy Trust fund** held at the diocese per the endowment policy.

Outreach: Total \$13,957.36

•Childreach/PLAN \$395 was donated and sent to Childreach to sponsor Nicholas in Kenya.

- •The 2017 United Thank Offering was \$710.83.
- •The Good Friday offering was \$76 and sent to support The Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East

•Food Share The 2nd Sunday loose plate for Food Share was \$506.63 with an additional \$200.50 from the "Souper Bowl" soup sale.

- •The mission plate offerings were \$2,340.06 and were given to various missions (separate report).
- •Parrettie Fund alms given to various people in need: \$7,844.30.

•The Rector's discretionary fund inflow for 2017 was \$2,400 funded from the Parrettie Fund, with \$1,884.04 given in alms to various people in need.

*The finance committee recommended, and vestry approved putting the YMCA Rental income into a "savings account" to be used for needs outside of the operating budget. 10% was tithed to Mission; there is \$4,095 in the Mission Fund.

- •Electronic giving was discussed and approved by the vestry in 2016 and implemented in February 2017.
- •Please see the Statement of Financial Position for the total financial picture.
