A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

Dear Friends,

Notes from the harvest: 10 days away in September, with no one to water the garden was a tactical error!!!

We knew that at an intuitive level, but the shriveled and desiccated vines that bore the heat of mid-September without support were a sight to behold. Dry and lifeless, the abundant watering on our return was scarcely able to turn a single leaf to green again, or to restore the flow of the life principle to the vine. Clearly the patient, routine, day-by-day, week-by-week tending of life's appetites supports and deepens life in one's experience and formation.

Notes from the Treasurer: end of the 3rd Quarter 2018

As we close out the 3rd Quarter of 2018, there is nothing remarkable to report about the 2018 budget. Pledges have caught up and are under \$1,000 over the expected arrearage. Thanks everyone! Many expense lines are under budget but we have a healthy reserve to cover those expenses when/if needed. Some of the capital expenses have been paid out of the savings fund as approved by the vestry. We will be paying the bill for the brick pointing and the balance on the heat soon, but with more capital expenses to come.

The vestry reviewed a draft budget for 2019, prepared by the finance committee. We look forward to pledge cards coming in during our recommitment Sunday, November 18, 2018.

Building update:

We received and accepted an estimate for the slate roof hole repair for \$3,000; two thirds of the cost is for the lift. The good news is Chris Rice from Cole Contracting climbed up to view the room over the sacristy and there is no water evident there (or anything else!). Chris believes the water is being deflected to the trim at the roof edge where the slate is missing, and not entering the building. The water entering the sacristy is from a crack in the lintel stone and can be repaired with silicone. Cole Contracting thinks it is likely that the tree branches broke loose the slate during a storm. We submitted an insurance claim which was awarded for \$2,000. At this time we have money in the building fund and savings to cover these essential repairs, but going forward, we will need fresh infusion of money if we expect to be able to maintain our 150-year-old building.

Work started the week of October 15. Tamsin did some further negotiating with Cole, investigated Holy Trinity's renting the lift for 7 days, so in addition to the slate repair, we can start the badly needed repair of the wood rot in that section of the church, along with replacing the missing gutter guard and repairing the crack in the lintel stone under a sanctuary window. While we have the lift, we have hired our former sexton, Hector Chapa, to trim and remove tree branches that are touching and dragging on the slate. At the same time Brian Canty, our lately retired sexton, is doing some exterior painting, other small jobs, and assisting with the tree trimming project. THANK YOU BRIAN!! And finally, Mrs. Tamsin Lucey is doing a fantastic job orchestrating everything. That is a mighty baton she wields!!
