# DECEMBER TIDINGS

Dear Friends!

Advent begins a new church year with a quiet build-up to the Holy birth. Tradition calls us to renew our use of the ancient disciplines: prayer, scripture, silence, and waiting with active hope. We hope God will draw near and give us inspiration and be born anew within the soul.

Here is a journey that can easily be taken! Paul's letter to the Galatians is a short piece, only six chapters. One can read it in a single sitting, or read it by chapters over a few days. One might read it several times in the four weeks of Advent.

What makes this such an interesting exercise is that it is a reflection on who we are in Christ during a time of conflict and polarization. We can read it to put a new frame around our current climate of accusation and suspicion. Just to introduce the characters: Paul has begun to preach beyond Israel, in the Gentile cities. The Apostle Peter has come to "inspect the troops" and happily eats with the Gentile convert without regard for Jewish dietary laws. But when Judaizers (proponents of a full emersion into Jewish law for Gentile converts) arrive in Galatia, Peter

draws back from his new friends in Christ, and the new freedoms he has experienced. Paul (a.k.a. 'speaks truth to power') does just that! And the holy fur flies!

Let's live with the scriptural truth even as we contemplate the source and meaning of the conflict we are in; and pray God to lead us out of the wilderness. Happy Advent!!! I remain, Your friend and Rector, (The Reverend) Richard S. Signore
