#### Adult Social Studies Class

The Social Studies group has begun our study of the "White Privilege: Let's Talk" curriculum provided by the United Church of Christ. This course helps those of us who are white understand institutionalized white privilege and how we benefit from it. It is so deeply embedded into our culture and daily lives that it is invisible to those of us who benefit, while being very obvious to those who are excluded from it.

Some of the questions that help us understand this concept are:

- In stores that sell children's toys, what races are shown in the dolls and figurines you find?
- In local pharmacies, can you find a band-aid that would blend in with brown or black skin?
- Did this country ever pass laws to prevent your full participation based on the color of your skin? Has this country ever debated the monetary value of all the people who look like you?

# Episcopal Church Women Report 2020

We started 2020 by reading "Things Seen and Unseen," by Nora Gallagher. We read the first two chapters, Advent and Christmas, and met at Diane Nichol's house in January. We met again at Susan Howland's house on March 8th to talk about the Epiphany and Lent chapters. Both times we had a lively discussion.

Several women "mentored" children who helped at the Mardi Gras Pancake Supper.... many thanks!

For Lent we offered the opportunity to read <u>The Poetry of Lent: A Lenten Companion to Mary Oliver's</u> <u>"Devotions".</u> The ECW bought a group license for the companion and all information was posted to our Facebook Group.

With Diane's Cancer diagnosis combined with COVID19 we did not hold any more in person meetings, but there was a fair amount of connection on our Facebook Group, and we were not neglectful of pastoral care. Many women wrote cards, made phone calls, and checked up on parish members and continue to do so.

Diane, Traci, and Hope all had major surgery in August. Along with prayer vigils for all three, \$363 was contributed for flowers and food. Traci, Hope, and Diane had flowers delivered either in the hospital or at home, and Traci and Diane received meals delivered to their houses from the ECW and from others. The total spent was \$282, so we have \$81 in reserve for future pastoral care needs.

In August we started collecting recipes for a new Holy Trinity Cookbook. It will be available in 2021.

We were sad to say good-bye to Diane on October 16<sup>th</sup>. Her memorial service was held by Zoom from Holy Trinity on October 24<sup>th</sup>.

Our 30<sup>th</sup> Annual Christmas Cookie Sale was held "Virtually" on Zoom Sunday, December 21<sup>st</sup>. We had a good turnout of people. The Burnes' were eating French butter cookies, Peg brought sour cream chocolate chip and fruitcake cookies, Cat and Phoebe brought a "special" small bag of cookies... Jones' favorite are chocolate chip. Eileen and David had decorated sugar cookies, Mick and Barbara brought Russian tea cake, cut cookies and chocolate blossoms; Lynn had Pizzelles and Nancy brought sugar cookies. Robin, Susan, and Tamsin attended. The Virtual Christmas Cookie sale raised \$340: \$170 will go to Foodshare and \$170 will go to the Liberian ministry at HTC.
