Dear friends!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!! The Lord is Risen indeed. Alleluia!!

Keep shouting; and in the context of the liturgy we are moving from one "station to another" as the Holy Spirit reveals the depth of Christ's Love as Savior, Shepherd, Healer & Guide. It is a lovely walk through the dimensions of the life of God as Easter Season unfolds! The Emmaus Rd story; (the living Christ present in Word and Sacrament) Doubting Thomas; (the challenge of interiorizing an inner faith) the Risen Christ on the beach eating broiled fish; (the faith that God raises

from death) - and now Good Shepherd Sunday; (listening to the inner Christ) and as Christ Ascends to heaven; (He is filling the whole world with His presence). The Season turns on the Pentecost Festival; (the power of the Spirit to enable the Church to carry the face of Christ to the world, to be the face of Christ to the world)! This journey starts in a physical context of broken bread, broken bones; Eucharist tasting of Heaven; and ends with a New Covenant written on the Heart (Jeremiah 31:31) by the living Spirit.

So keep shouting!! Let this Risen Savior rejoice in your heart!! The theologian Alexander Schmemann has observed: "For fifty days after Easter it is granted to us to live in the paschal joy, to experience time as the feast. Then comes the "last and great day" of Pentecost and with it our return to the real time of this world. At Vespers that night, the Christians are required to kneel for the first time since Easter....." Don't go back to the world of struggle without first drinking deeply of the Living God while we are still held in resurrection Joy! Keep shouting,...and,...don't put away that bell yet!!!! Hail thee festival day!!

## **Mission & Outreach**

The Mission Plate funds for the months of May and June will be going to "Trees, Water and People". Trees, Water, and People's mission is to improve lives by helping indigenous communities to protect, conserve and manage their natural resources.

T.W.P. work in the United States Tribal Lands, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua to design conservation projects that improve the environment and human health, while creating economic opportunity for the local communities.

Their work includes developing programs to combat "energy poverty", provide "clean" cookstoves, reforestation programs, cleaner water and nutritious food production through sustainable family agriculture.

Energy poverty is defined as the lack of adequate modern energy for the basic needs of cooking, warmth, and lighting. This need for energy creates economic, environmental, human health and human rights issues, which leads to preventable illnesses and deplorable living conditions. T.W.P. work with indigenous communities to build and install renewable energy applications which include off-grid solar air furnaces and small wind turbines.

Developing community-based reforestation programs and food production programs, through sustainable family agriculture, has led to cleaner water, healthier soils and improved nutrition, and more self-sufficient communities.

Our church funding supports all these programs which develop sustainable self-sufficient communities for these indigenous people.
