# Vestry Highlights: May 11, 2022

At our retreat on May 11<sup>th</sup>, the Vestry considered our priorities in four areas of ministry: Worship, Faith Formation, Pastoral Care/Fellowship, and Outreach/Community Partnerships.

### <u>Worship</u>

Increase membership in Altar Guild (especially with the departure of Bill and Peg Nelson) Take leadership in planning an ecumenical Thanksgiving Service

Continue increasing the cultural and ethnic diversity in our worship music

## Faith Formation

Develop an adult program based on a set curriculum on the Episcopal church or an Episcopal curriculum on theology or scripture.

Restructure youth and children's curriculum:

- a program that that will prepare teens for confirmation at the next bishop's visitation in the fall of 2023
- a program for children (ages 4-12) that supports parents who lead the program

## Pastoral Care/Fellowship

Reinstate the Pastoral Care Team to meet with Mother Judith quarterly

Include pastoral check-ins on the monthly Vestry agenda

Organize 2 off-site parish events or outings: One this summer and one in the winter (January/ February)

Reinstate the International Dinner to be held in November

#### **Outreach/Community Partnerships**

Continue current projects: Winter Coat Closet, Ukraine fundraising, Liberian collection, Cooking for Life program in partnership with St. Luke's Guesthouse

Rebuild our ecumenical partnerships to identify new projects for 2023



## **Family Worship Updates June 2022**

The Faith Formation Steering Committee met on May 25<sup>th</sup> to plan programs for the coming year. More details will be coming, but here are the programs we will be developing:



- A year-long program, beginning this summer, following a curriculum developed by the Forward Movement on the beliefs and practices of the Episcopal Church. The central text for this program is *Walk in Love*, by Scott Gunn & Melody Wilson Shobe (Forward Movement Press, 2018). The book is available on Amazon and Church Publishing. Please contact Cat Reith-Lowery to see about purchasing books with a group discount. More information about this program can be found at <u>https://www.forwardmovement.org/</u>. The Group will meet on 2 Thursdays each month at 7pm, once on Zoom and once in person. Dates TBA
- We will form a private Facebook Reading Group that will share insights and reflections on a monthly text.
- Bible Study Beginning this summer we will begin a series of in-person Bible Study meetings, each lasting 4-6 weeks. We may partner with Bethlehem Lutheran.

#### **Children and Youth**

VBS will be held in August, inviting children from the community.

For the 2022-2023 program year we will have two programs, details TBA:

A pre-confirmation curriculum for youth ages 13 and up

A Family Worship curriculum for children ages 4-12

Our youth will continue to lead the service on one Sunday each month.

# **Mission Plate for May & June**

The Mission Plate funds for the months of May and June is going to "Baby 2 Baby.". "Baby 2 Baby" is a mega-diaper bank and national non-profit organization which provides essential items to children in need across the United States. In the last ten years, Baby 2 Baby has distributed over 200 million items to children living in homeless shelters, domestic violence programs, foster care, hospitals and underserved schools, as well as children who have lost everything in the wake of disasters, such as fires, floods, and hurricanes. Baby 2 Baby networks with local agencies to distribute essential items throughout the United States. The effects of the pandemic have further exacerbated the needs of low- income families with children living across our country. For these families, diapers are often one of the largest expenses, preceded by food, rent and utilities. Through Baby 2 Baby's Covid-19 relief work, the organization has distributed 50 million critical items including diapers, formula, clothing, cribs, soap, shampoo, school supplies, hand sanitizer, masks, food and more to one million children in over 100 cities across the country.

## **Daughters Of the King: Update on the Liberian Project**

Blessings to all! We recently received word that our last shipment of supplies arrived in Liberia. We have been told that these supplies have been joyfully received and are being put to good use. The critical donations we send for these children and young mothers help support living in the boarding schools run by the local churches. These churches provide shelter, food, education and protection for these children and young mothers. Young girls are often exploited and sold as "teenage brides" currently in Liberia. Our contact person in Liberia is Julia Duncan-Cassell. She is president of the Sons and Daughters of the King of the Episcopal Church in Buchanan Liberia. Julia has told us that the following supplies are critically needed: feminine hygiene pads, deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap, Vaseline (petroleum jelly), and cocoa butter cream. "Depend" type disposables are in need for the elderly in the community. Also, P.P.E. supplies are critically needed including: face masks, hand sanitizer, "low splash" bleach and disposable gloves. We are hoping to send out a new shipment of supplies (donations) fairly soon. Please, donate what you can. All shipping costs are being paid for by a grant. Donations can be dropped off in the fover before and after our church services or during office hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Thank you so much for your continuing support of this important ministry.
