# **VESTRY MEETING MINUTES**

#### November 9, 2022

 OPENING BUSINESS

Acceptance of Minutes: October 12, 2022 – Jean Frost A motion made to accept minutes from the October Vestry meeting, it was seconded and carried.

## Treasurer's Report: October – Nancy Waugh

**Resolution:** To accept a memorial gift in memory of Mary Hicks, and ask the Endowment Committee to recommend how it will be designated. A Motion was made to accept the \$10,000 memorial gift from Mary Hick's sister, it was seconded, and carried. Susan, as head of endowment committee, and after communication with 2/3 of the endowment Committee and the Executive Committee, spoke about uses for the memorial money – 1. New altar vestments, 2. fund the cost for Postulant to the Diaconate (which is 1/3 of the total cost, the Postulant is responsible for 1/3 and the Diocese funds 1/3) 3. Remainder to be placed into the Legacy Fund, which is within our endowment fund and there are regulations about its use. A motion made to distribute the money as recommended by the Endowment Comm, it was seconded, and carried. A motion made to accept the Treasurer's report, it was seconded and carried.

Update: UTO Ingathering – Susan Howland reported that the United Thank Offering from Holy Trinity was \$1,42.69. This was our largest UTO contribution.

**Debriefing:** What have we done well? – The service last Sunday went very well, many of the kids went up to sit on stairs in front of the altar together, the Teens raised \$200 for Cancer Research selling cider, hot chocolate and baked goods, Mary Hicks' funeral went very well, the Stewardship Breakfast went well. Mother Judith was very surprised that we celebrated her birthday. Landscaping around the church is going well. We have done quite a bit that we can be thankful for, and we need to keep at it. What could we have done better? There were no responses to this question.

A motion was made to renew the license of each of the above volunteers, it was seconded and carried.

**Resolution:** Building committee Proposal for protective fencing on the side of the building – Proposal from building comm was approved, a motion was made, seconded, and carried. **Resolution:** Accept Lynn Garland's gift designated for a new bench in front of the church – A motion was made to accept \$500 gift to purchase a bench to replace the present one. It was seconded and carried. The balance of the gift, after purchasing the bench, may be used for the operating budget.

**Resolution:** Authorize Cat Reith-Lowery to send Hospitality Survey and oversee results – postponed – more work needs to be done

**2023 Vestry Meeting Schedule:** Proposed change to 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesdays, beginning in January **Vestry Openings: January 2023** 

2 3-year Terms – Robin Yates and Eileen DeMings are eligible to stand for re-election and both are willing.

1 2-year term – Cat Reith-Lowery is eligible to stand for election and she is willing.

Officers – 1-year terms - all eligible for re-election and willing.

Date for Annual Parish Meeting: January 29, 2023

De-Briefing: Stewardship Breakfast 15 pledges came in on Sunday, Finance Comm will meet after more pledge cards come in to work on a proposed budget for 2023. Eileen asked about the possibility of a digital pledge card – there was interest in working on that for next year.
 De-briefing: Teens Fundraiser – raised \$200, lots of participation, good energy from the teens, there were 6 teens that took part. We need to support the Teens in ways that do not take away from their ownership of the projects they choose to do.

**Update:** Food collection for Food Share – Lynn spoke with Rose about restarting this Ministry and Rose is willing, Eileen recommended getting the Teens to work together with Rose, so she has help and support. Lynn will speak with Rose and have Rose call Eileen.

**Update:** Building Committee Proposal for the girls' bathroom in the classroom wing – Susan reported that committee has not yet met to make a formal decision and get an estimate. The proposal will be to cap the toilets, shut water off and remove the partitions.

**Update:** Support for Girl Scout Troop Operation Christmas Child - So far \$90 has been donated from Holy Trinity. The Federated Church in Sturbridge will be donating product to be put into the boxes. The shipping fee is \$10 per box so as of now the girls plan to send out 9 boxes. They got the shoe boxes from the organizing company in Mass. The shoe boxes will be put together between November 13-20, then blessed at HTC on the 20<sup>th</sup> and delivered to be shipped out on the 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup>.

**Update:** Community Thanksgiving Service – Tuesday November 22, Lynn has agreed to head up the reception afterwards. She may ask for help.

**Update:** Blue Shades Clarinets Concert – December 11: \$600 in funding has been promised and \$300 of that has been received. (Or at least was available for pick-up as of Wednesday November 9<sup>th</sup>.)

**Update:** Greening of the Church: December 18<sup>th</sup> Lynn requested sturdier bobeches to catch the wax dripping off the candles. Nancy Waugh indicated she would look into that. (Advent Lessons & Carols w/Communion & Children's Chapel)
