Mampong Babies Home in Kumasi, Ghana News

In 2023 we started monthly sponsorships for the Mampong Babies Home in Kumasi, Ghana. There is a sign-up sheet on the table at the back of the church and 4 months are still available:

The sponsorship money along with whatever is put in the "Big Bottle" will go to Change the Babies ministry/Mampong Babies Home.

A little history...

Our diocese has had a companion relationship with the diocese of Kumasi, Ghana since 2008. In 2014 The Rev. Betsy Fisher started the "Change the

Babies" ministry to support the Mampong Babies Home. Lana was at the diocesan convention that year and brought the idea back to Holy Trinity and we have been collecting money in the "BIG Bottle" ever since. The diocese has collected well over \$10,000 through the "Change the Babies" ministry to support the Mampong Babies Home

Mampong Babies Home cares for about 50 children and specializes in taking in infants whose mothers have died in childbirth or shortly after. They are able to provide good care for the babies who otherwise would often not survive. They maintain communication with the families of origin and try to reunite the babies with relatives as soon as it is practical and safe. They also take abandoned children.

Daughters of the King: Liberian Project Update

I am happy to report great joyous news. After over thirty-three years, Lorraine Brumskine has returned to Liberia to visit her family and homeland. Lorraine is visiting her oldest son and three grandchildren, whom she has never seen in person. She will return at the end of April.

During her stay in Liberia, Lorraine is also visiting the Sons and Daughters of the King of the Episcopal Church in Buchanan. Upon her return, Lorraine will give us an update on how our shipments of supplies are being utilized there.

Lorraine has recently informed us that the schools, run by the churches, are in critical need of supplies. The schools need children's textbooks in math, science, social studies, and language arts. There are not enough books to provide for their learning. If anyone has access to textbooks (yes, even older ones) they would be more than happy to receive them. Also, we are actively seeking donations of all kinds of children's reading books (trade books), and workbooks, and school supplies such as writing paper, notebooks, pencils, pens, crayons, scissors, glue, etc. Every donation helps keep the schools running and the children getting the precious gift of an education. We hope to send out our next shipment of supplies in late Spring. Please, give what you can.

March & April "Lent" Mission Plate



The Mission Plate funds for April will be going to Episcopal Relief & Development. E.R.D. is working with Action by Churches Together Alliance (ACT Alliance) in response to the 7.8 magnitude earthquake in Turkey and Syria that has killed over 43,000 people. Of the 4.2 million people living in Syria alone more than half of them have been displaced by the earthquake. The devastation in both countries is unimaginable.
