## A Reflection from Your Priest-in-Charge

There's a wideness in God's mercy, like the wideness of the sea. There's a kindness in God's justice, which is more than liberty.

Walter Brueggemann's reflection on the wonder of God's mercy is our compass for our journey through Lent: Once you had not received mercy, and now you have received mercy. That's all. That's everything.

Mercy is a gift of faith that we tend to take for granted or that we assume is reserved for other people—people who "really need it." But living with mercy is transformative. The hymn quoted above puts it well. Walking in mercy brings a tenderness to the world which may be needed more than the fierceness and passion that we are more likely to witness.

Trusting in God's mercy frees us to tell the full story of our lives- our personal story and the story of Holy Trinity—to include what we wish we had done and what we wish we had not done. For stories told and heard with mercy include dreams and hopes that still stir us. People who have received mercy can see that unrealized dreams may not be failures but rather they might have been wrongheaded, based on what we thought other people expected of us rather than on discernment of God's purpose.

When we ponder what a *merciful* God might be calling us to become, we may see unanticipated possibilities for our future.

When we consider the *wideness* of God's mercy and the *kindness* of God's justice, we may be more patient with ourselves and with the people who frustrate us.

On March11<sup>th</sup>, the Vestry will meet with Canon Simpson to review the results of the CAT survey, and on March 29<sup>th</sup> the Vestry will meet to plan the next steps in your transition. As one Vestry member put it so well: We will choose a path to walk together, and we will work cooperatively to prepare for what comes next.

The words of John O'Donohue express the vision of people who have received mercy:

You are in this time of the interim Where everything seems withheld. The path you took to get here has washed out;

The way forward is still concealed from you.

As far as you can, hold your confidence. Do not allow your confusion to squander

This call which is loosening Your roots in false ground, That you might come free from all you have outgrown.

Lent Madness: Beginning on Thursday February 23<sup>rd</sup> and culminating on Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup>. A link to biographical information and ballots will be sent each week. To learn more see https://lentmadness.org

What is Lent Madness? Lent Madness is a Lenten devotion that offers an opportunity to learn about 32 outstanding, faithful followers of Christ, to have some fun, and to build up our community at Holy Trinity through sharing our learning and insights.

How does Lent Madness work? The format is modelled after the NCAA "March Madness": 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; 8 advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; 4 make it to the Faithful Four; 2 to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. In subsequent rounds quotes, quirks, and legends are added to each bio.

This year's bracket is broken up into four quadrants: Ancient & Apostolic; Mostly Monastics; Royals Roundup; and Modern Mayhem. Each bracket contains some well-known saints along with some obscure ones. But they all inspire us by following Jesus in their own times and in their own ways.

How do I participate? You will receive an email from the Holy Trinity with a link to biographical information of the saints who are paired for the specific competition and a ballot. Rose Reith and Tamsin Lucey will tally the votes and prepare the subsequent ballots. There will be a deadline for each vote. The first email was sent on Thursday February 23rd, and the competition between the final two candidates for the "Golden Halo Award will be held during the service on Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup>. You may join in the voting at any time; you do not need to begin with the first ballot.

Lorraine will be visiting her oldest son and three grandchildren whom she has personally never seen. She departed on February 23<sup>rd</sup> and will return in April.

During her stay in Liberia, she also will visit the Sons and Daughters of the King of the Episcopal Church in Buchanan. Upon her return, Lorraine will give us an update on how our shipments of supplies are being utilized there.

Lorraine has recently informed us that the schools, run by the churches, are in critical need of supplies. The schools need children's textbooks in math, science, social studies, and language arts. There are not enough books to provide for their learning. If anyone has access to textbooks (yes, even older ones) they would be more than happy to receive them. Also, we are actively seeking donations of all kinds of children's reading books (trade books), and workbooks, and school supplies such as writing paper, notebooks, pencils, pens, crayons, scissors, glue, etc. Every donation helps keep the schools running and the children getting the precious gift of an education. We hope to send out our next shipment of supplies in late spring. Please, give what you can.
