A Reflection from your Priest-in-Charge

I want you woven into a tapestry of love, in touch with everything there is to know of God. Then you will have minds confident and at rest, focused on Christ, God's great mystery. [Colossians 2:2]

In this passage, Paul expresses what I think is the deepest hope of every Christian community. He focuses on the rich diversity that our faith frees us to enjoy. He does not call us to conform, but to cherish the different strands of our shared life in Christ. He does not call us to battle the forces of darkness or to political struggle, but to trust in the divine mystery that we will never be able to understand or explain. If we allow ourselves to be "woven into a tapestry of love" we will recognize that we are inherently unfinished, and God's purpose is ever unfolding. That insight will free us to face injustice with hope rather than anger. . That trust will free us to be patient with ourselves and fearless in our plans.

This is helpful to keep in mind as we begin the summer, a season of coming and going, of rest and adventure, of exploration and renewal. It is a time to "let go and let God." Let God weave together the different pieces of our lives. Let God bring together our scattered friends and family. Let God make us whole.

As you begin preparations for new ministry, let the rich complexity of Holy Trinity's history and aspirations be woven together in an unfolding pattern. We often say that God has a plan, but every weaver knows that the finished piece is always different from the image that was its starting point. Let us be both humbled and emboldened by our faith, *our minds confident and at rest.*

Prayer Partners


Over the summer, we invite everyone to sign up for a

Shelby Van Pelt, *Remarkably Bright Creatures* [Ecco Press, 2022] Discussion: Thursday, July 27, @ 7pm


