**Lunch and Learn**: A monthly midday discussion group.

**Sunday School**: Our children will meet during the service one Sunday each month for an hour-long class based on the VBS curriculum and close with Holy Communion in the chapel.

**Teens:** Our teens will partner with youth from Bethlehem Lutheran for faith formation, service projects, and fellowship.

**Sleep-Out 4 Homelessness:** We will support this first annual event sponsored by St. Luke's Guesthouse as part of a national effort to raise awareness and advocacy for the homeless..



veloped a passion for Islam before discovering, almost against his will, evidence that Jesus rose from the dead and claimed to be God. Unable to deny the arguments but not wanting to deny his family, Qureshi struggled with an inner turmoil that will challenge Christians, Muslims, and all those who are interested in two of the world's greatest religions and the quest for truth. Qureshi--with great courage and intimacy--wrote this book with three major purposes in mind:

Providing an intimate view into a loving Muslim home, Qureshi shares how he de-

• To tear down walls between Christianity and Islam by giving non-Muslim readers an insider's perspective into a Muslim's heart and mind.

• To equip the reader with facts and knowledge, showing the strength of the case for the gospel contrasted with the case for Islam.

• To portray the immense inner struggle of Muslims grappling with the gospel, including all the sacrifices and doubts that rise along the way.

Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus a story about the transformative grace and mercy of the one true God.

We will partner with Bethlehem Lutheran and the Federated Church of Sturbridge for monthly viewing and discussion of Season 1 of this popular video series about the life and ministry of Christ. 


### Sleep Out 4 Homelessness: October 7<sup>th</sup> or 14<sup>th</sup> Fundraiser for St. Luke's Guesthouse

### **Food Pantry**

In September our donations will go to the Wales Community Food Pantry, which serves the towns of Brimfield, Holland and Wales. It services lowincome families, senior citizens, and disabled veterans. Volunteers also deliver food to homebound clients. Rose Reith will deliver our donations on Monday mornings.



They have requested the following items:

- Canned soups-and specifically they always need ramen soup.
- Crackers
- Cereal Cheerios, Chex, Oatmeal
- Jelly, Jam, Peanut Butter, and Marshmallow Fluff
- Canned carrots, peas and potatoes.
- Condiments like salad dressings, oils, mayonnaise, ketchup and mustard, pickles, etc.
- Juices shelf stable grape, apple, etc.
- Orange juice
- The larger styles of pasta like rigatoni and penne they get lots of spaghetti and elbows donated, but few of the other shapes.
- Treats such as individually packaged cupcakes and cookies.

In the coming months, we will alternate between donations to Wales and donations to the Bridge Fridge, located at 11 Sandersdale Road, Southbridge.

We will continue to support Food Share with financial donations on the second Sunday of each month.
