#### A Reflection from your Priest-in-Charge

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives.

Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

[John 14:27]

In a volume of story meditations titled *Taking Flight* Anthony De Mello tells the story of an old man who would sit very still in church for hours at a time. One day the priest asked him what God talked to him about. "God doesn't talk. He just listens," the old man replied

"What do you talk to him about?" asked the priest.

"I don't talk either," said the old man. "I just listen."

This fable reminds us to find a space of silence amidst the bombardment of unbearable images of war from Israel, Palestine, and Ukraine, of the crowds at our own borders, of the posturing of our congressional leaders, and of the unfolding news of the mass shooting in Lewiston, Maine.

We have already received the gift of a peace beyond understanding. We do not need to seek it. We do not need to be discouraged by its elusiveness. We do not need to bemoan the ways so many of us abuse it or squander it. We have been given the peace of Christ. Perhaps more importantly, we have been given the capacity to share it.

I believe that there is nothing more important than to grow into this peace and to teach our children to grow into it. It is a truism that peace begins within each person, that there will be peace around us only after there is peace within us.

In our restlessness and outrage, *let's just listen*.

In exploring alternative models for ministry, *let's just listen*.

In considering the wisest stewardship of our building, *let's just listen*. In admitting how much we do not know, *let's just listen*.

In our impulse to blame, *let's just listen*.

In our dreams and hopes for our children, *let's just listen*.

Peace is a gift, not a given.

Our only purpose in our brief lives is to awaken in each other the peace that the world cannot give.

We have been promised that we can do this. *Let's just listen*.

#### Update on Our New Neighbors at the Super 8 Motel in Sturbridge.

As highlighted in October, unhoused families are now living at the Super 8 Motel in Sturbridge until they can move to permanent housing. I volunteered to be the "point person" to receive and share information for Holy Trinity from the area coordinator, Mary Carpenter.

#### We no longer need to collect donations. Read on.

Many have contributed essential items that the families needed (Thank you!!). Collection sites were set up, especially the ecumenical site at the Federated Church in Sturbridge. The state has now organized and centralized collections for the motels in our area. The National Guard along with the planners in Worcester have decided to make Seven Hills on Hope Avenue in Worcester the ONE main drop-off site. Donations may be dropped off ONLY on Mondays and Wednesday from 9am-1pm. People will still be living at the Super 8 but the distribution to the motel will come from this centralized site.

An informational flier is available by request (email the church) and in a previously sent parish wide email notice. The Federated Church drop off is closed and the collection site in Southbridge will also stop receiving items.

The newcomers now have the following support:

- Health care through MassHealth is now provided.
- EBT cards (food stamps) with a stipend of money on the card for items not normally covered.
- WIC for families with infants so parents can buy formula.
- Work permits are on the agenda, so that families can start earning an income.




Nora Gallagher, Things Seen & Unseen [Vintage Books, 1999]
