ChildFund was founded in 1938, in Richmond, Virginia as China's Children's Fund. In 1951, it became Christian Children's fund. In 2009, it became Childfund International. ChildFund's headquarters are in Richmond, Virginia.

ChildFund is a global community of people who care about children and take action to help them live at their fullest potential at every stage of their lives. ChidFund is a non-profit organization that helps children in need by providing support for health, education, and safety. They work with local partners in countries around the world. Their mission is to help children reach their full potential and realize their rights. They work to end poverty, violence, abuse, and exploitation. ChildFund helps children get ready for school and complete basic education. They support community-based health care, including prenatal care, maternal health, and childhood illnesses. ChildFund works to protect children from violence, abuse, exploitation, and neglect.

In 2023 ChildFund helped 14.8 million people in 23 countries to improve their access to health care, nutrition, education, livelihoods and protection, strengthening local organizations to continue supporting such services in their communities even after ChildFund is gone.

UTO Thankfulness Gratitude Practice

We tend to focus on the United Thank Offering as a way to give financial support to others; an offering we give in the Fall. But there is a second part that is equally important for us. That is a daily practice of thankfulness or gratitude. It is easy to be thankful when things are going our way. But it is even more important to practice thankfulness, or gratitude, when things are not going well. When we are able to find something to be grateful for, even during the most dire situations, this helps us cope better with whatever is going on. More importantly, it helps us remember that God is ALWAYS with us and loves us, no matter what.







I encourage us to start a gratitude practice even if we don't connect it with a financial UTO offering. The United Thank Offering project gives us a simple structure to reinforce this important daily spiritual practice, combining gratitude with offering. Get a UTO Box if you don't have one (find them on a table in the fover). Each day, even if just for a moment, focus your attention on one thing you are truly thankful for, no matter how dire a situation is or how many other things are causing feelings of distress. Feel the gratitude (this is important!) and put something in the box: maybe a coin. Or maybe write what you are grateful for on a piece of paper and put that in. Or just put your hand on the box and say "thank you, God" or "thank you, Jesus". Or maybe you find a completely different way to practice gratitude that works for you.
